On December 17, 2012 with the passing of Jerry Moon, the fishing industry lost not only an icon but also a pioneer in the live release of bass in competitive tournaments, conserva-

tion and restocking.

Jerry was instrumental in the first designs of 'Live Release Boats' partnered with Toyo Shimano, Tom Brooke and Princecraft Boats in Canada. Before becoming fully dedicated to the healthy release

of bass in competitive tournaments he was a Canadian pro circuit angler partnered with Mack Teegarten from Pennsylvania and occasionally with Tom Brooke from Shimano,

Canada. With the stepping in of PETA and the short growing season for smallmouth bass in Canada, an answer had to be found and Jerry was a key factor in the resolution of both problems.

The first 'Live Release' boats were designed on Princecraft V-hull boats. It was then discovered a larger boat was required for this and a pontoon boat was required for the excess weight of the tanks, water, aeration and equipment that was required.

Jerry drove and worked the 'Live Release Boats' from coast to coast. Not only returning healthy bass caught in tournaments back into their native waters to be caught again another day but also participating and assisting in restocking programs from Lake Mead, Lake Havasu plus other lakes and reservoirs across the nation. One of the 'Live Release Boats' was donated to BASS and several other boats were built and sent to the United States to help in the preservation of bass.

In 1988 Jerry was a key factor in translating com-petitive fishing into a marketing value when he became the Shimano Representative for Texas, Oklahoma, Arkansas, and Louisiana along with his other responsibilities as a rep for Lowrance and return sales with Skeeter. "To think, Jerry did all of this without a computer, just a big cheap tablet," said his wife Terri Moon.

Tom Brooke, now retired from Shimano but head

of Canadian Fish & Game said, "Shimano is still reaping the benefits of all the hard work Jerry did in his field!"

In 2001 Jerry donated the tanks that are now on the Lake Fork Sportsman's Association Live Release Boat. His only request to me when he donated the tanks was that his name would not be associated with it but the Shimano logo should always be on the lids, because they made it possible. With every bass saved on Lake Fork Jerry will be remembered.

Some men are not so much remembered by their names but more so by their deeds and accomplishments. Jerry Moon did this. I'm so proud to say I was his friend and myself and many others will miss him dearly. My condolences and prayers go out to his wife Terri and to all of the family and friends.

Twelve chapters of the Texas Master Naturalist tact information. program are conducting 2013 winter/spring training classes for volunteers wanting to learn about natural resource and conservation management.


New Year Bassin on the Fork

Happy New Year from Lake Fork! Wow another year has come and gone already. The older I get, seems like the faster the years pass. I am so thankful to God for the blessings of last year and really looking forward to the 2013 season.

January is a turning point for the fishing patterns for us as bass anglers. This time of year bass will begin to move up as they head to the pre-spawn areas. The male fish will usually show up first and then the big females will start showing themselves later in the month and into early February.

I like to fish grass beds this time of year on points and flats. I also flip trees and lay down logs along creek channels leading into early spawning areas. For the grass bed fishing one of my favorite ways



is to run lipless crankbaits along the outer edges of the weed lines. Points and cuts are usually great ambush points for bass and definitely high percentage areas to key in on. You can also fish a jig on the grass edges. Stumps along the outer edges are another great ambush point for a big ole mama bass that is heading to the shallows to get a little

The Sebile Flatt Shad in the Matte Orange/Yellow Crawdad is a super choice while cranking the grass for Lake Fork Hawgs. For the jig I like to go with the ole trusty Stanley Jig in 3/8 or half ounce in black and blue or black brown and amber color. For the jig trailer definitely go with the Berkley Chigger Craw. The Stanley Jig and Chigger Craw are a deadly combination!

You can still catch some deep fish in January. But it seems like once the days start getting longer and January starts rolling along, more and more fish start moving up. Keep in mind the weather as well. On the shallow fish in January the best bite can be in the afternoon especially if the nights have been cold. If the weather has been warm and not cooling down too bad at night, you can catch them in the mornings as well. At any rate, January is a good time to catch a huge fish.

So what is your new year's resolution going to be? I'm hoping mine involves about a 14 pounder



on a lipless crankbait or a jig. Come on down to Lake Fork if your resolution is to try to catch the biggest bass of your life in 2013. They are out there swimming around waiting on you!

crappie with a double jig in 30 feet of water near the dam when the big bass bit. "She made several long runs, and at first I thought it was a catfish, because we had already caught several," Sims said. "Finally she came up and I lipped her."

Lake Fork has now produced 250 of the 538 entries into the ShareLunker program.

Genetic information on file shows the fish is an intergrade, or a cross between pure Florida largemouth and northern largemouth bass. Pure Floridas are held for spawning, while intergrades are returned to the lake as soon as possible. Fish caught on or after April 15 will

into the program but will not be transported to Athens for spawning. Experience shows that fish caught late in the season typically do not spawn in time for the offspring to be stocked before water temperatures rise beyond the optimum level for survival of the fingerlings.

Anyone legally catching a 13-pound or bigger largemouth bass from Texas waters, public or private, between October 1 and April 30 may submit the fish to the Toyota ShareLunker program by calling the ShareLunker hotline at (903) 681-0550 or paging (888) 784-0600 and leaving a phone number

ShareLunker entries are used in a selective breeding program at the Texas Freshwater Fisheries Center (TFFC) in Athens. Some of the offspring from these fish are stocked back into the water body from which they were caught. Other Share-Lunker offspring are stocked in public waters around the state in an attempt to increase the overall size and growth rate of largemouth bass in Texas.

Anglers entering fish into the Toyota Share-Lunker program receive a free replica of their fish, a certificate and ShareLunker clothing and are recognized at a banquet at the Texas Freshwater Fisheries Center in Athens. All fish accepted into the program become official entries whether spawned or not, and anglers still receive all program prizes.

The person who catches the season's largest entry will be named Angler of the Year and will receive a prize package from G. Loomis. If a Texas angler catches the largest entry of the season, that person also receives a lifetime fishing license.

"The Moon Report" January Crappie on the Fork

Once again I say it's hard to believe the year is over. Another awesome year of fishing we've had here on Lake Fork. We really lucked out weather wise in December for the most part with a few 60-70 degree days and then on Christmas day look what happened... we were hit with all that snow!

I know January will bring cooler weather with not as many fishable days. So, it's time to check out all the boat and tackle shows in your area.

The growth of the crappie fishing industry over the past few years is just amazing! The tackle, the electronics and even the boats are finally putting the crappie fishermen in mind.

Just a few years ago almost all of us were in 14 to 16 feet boats. Most without any type of electronics, some didn't even have trolling motors. Now we are in longer, wider, deeper, safer, made for rough water boats. Even the salt-water center console boats are

making their way into the crappie market. In these boats, the larger live wells and the open floor plans, the latest in electronics and trolling motors, are all becoming a part of the crappie fishing world.

Probably the fastest growing change I've seen is the amount of "Four Stroke" motors showing up among us crappie fishermen. Aren't they awesome? My Yamaha 115 "Four Stroke" has made a huge difference in my fishing (because of all the money I save in gas, it practically pays for itself), and they are so quiet. If you're thinking about a change, be sure and check out the Yamaha "Four Strokes" at your local boat and tackle show. Also while you're there, look at the boats that are available and give the dealers suggestions that would make their boat a "bet-

ter" crappie fishing rig.

Next while you're there, when it comes to electronics there's only one word "Lowrance." Be sure and check them out

With the way the temperatures have been on Fork recently, the crappie are starting to bunch up. We have been catching them in 15 to 35 feet of water



TPWD Seeks Input on Possible Coastal Fisheries Regulation Changes

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) has scheduled three public scoping meetings in January to gather input about possible regulation changes for 2013-14. The scoping items include incorporation of a rule regarding recreational possession limit, clarification of fish harassment rules, bonus red drum tag requirement changes and new possession rules in state waters for aquatic resources in excess of federal limits.

All meetings will begin at 7 p.m. and are set for:

--Jan. 7 -- Dickinson TPWD Regional Office, 1502 FM 517 East;

--Jan. 9 -- Corpus Christi on the TAMU CC campus, NRC #1003, 6300 Ocean Dr.;

--Jan. 10 -- San Antonio at Bass Pro Shops, 17907 W. IH 10.

During the regulation restructuring process where fishing and hunting regulations were separated into their own chapters, language regarding the definition of recreational possession limit was not carried forward into the Statewide Recreational and Commercial Fishing Proclamations chapter. Though the definition currently is enforceable from the Statewide Hunting Proclamation, this proposal will incorporate the

Commercial Fishing Proclamation making it clearer. The language to be incorporated reads: The possession limit shall not apply after the wildlife resource has reached the possessor's permanent residence and is finally processed.

TPWD is also looking to clarify language in the regulations regarding fish harassment, which currently states that it is unlawful for any person to use any vessel to harass fish. In an attempt to clarify this definition to make it clearer, the department proposes the following language:

It is unlawful to use any vessel to harry, herd, or drive fish including but not limited to operating any vessel in a repeated circular course, for the purpose of or resulting in the artificial concentration of fish for the purpose of taking or attempting to take fish.


The department is also considering removing the prohibition regarding simultaneous possession of the red drum tag and bonus red drum tag. Currently anglers must obtain these two tags at separate times. In an effort to make it easier for those anglers who wish to harvest more than one oversized red drum (>28 inches), the department proposes eliminating this prohibition.

definition into the Statewide Recreational and As TPWD currently only issues about 7,000 bonus red drum tags annually, and oversized red drum makes up only 3 percent of the total harvest, the department expects no negative impact to the population. Anglers would still only be issued one bonus red drum tag annually.

> TPWD is also scoping a change making it a state violation for possession in state waters of aquatic resources taken in violation of federal regulations in the Exclusive Economic Zone. Differences currently exist between state and federal regulations. TPWD has maintained an annual agreement with the Office of Law Enforcement (OLE) of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration through which TPWD agrees to enforce federal regulations in state waters. The ability to enforce federal regulations will help prevent depletion and waste of aquatic resources.







Rare tropical bird spotted in Austin

The fork-tailed flycatcher, native to Central and South America, was spotted by birder Shelia Hargis recently near McKinney Falls State Park during Travis County Audubon's annual Christmas Bird Count.

Texas Parks and Wildlife biologist Mark Klym attributes the bird sighting so far North as a product of a confused migration path.

"The fork-tailed flycatcher usually comes from Argentina to Mexico at this time of year," Klym said. "Every once and a while one of them seems to overfly that northbound migration and end up in Texas."

Females are usually around 12 inches and males are larger at around 15 inches long. Though the bird is around a foot long it only weighs about an ounce making it ideal for gliding through thousands of miles of airspace.

Recently it was reported there were two forktailed flycatchers in the area, yet upon inspection of the image it was determined to be the flycatcher sitting with one of its relatives, the scissor-tailed flycatcher.

"We have so many people coming from all over Texas and the U.S. to see this bird," said park ranger Amber Conrad. "This bird is relatively small, it's like a little cotton ball with some black string hanging off of it for its head and its tail." Interest in the bird has brought visitors out in droves to the park with high-powered binoculars and professional video and photography equipment to capture the rare traveler. Groups of photographers seem to resemble the paparazzi as they work to get the perfect shot of the rare birds.

"A lot of people think it's funny, and I do to sometimes, that people have this kind of obsession about seeing birds," said Austin birder Chris Layten. "For me, it's getting the chance to be out and to have a more intimate connection with the natural world."

Layten and other birders flocked to the park and the surrounding area upon hearing of the flycatcher sighting. State birders have only documented 25 sightings of the fork-tailed flycatcher in Texas over the past 150 years, making this discovery sensational to bird enthusiasts across the nation.





"Pack of Knowledge" Resolutions for a Lucky '13 _

Just like doctors & engineers stay abreast of the latest technology and innovations or get left behind, anglers who ignore the latest fishing trends & info are likely to get outfished by their partners. Although fishing is not a vocation for most, who wouldn't have more fun by catching more and bigger fish next year? With the goal of more big fish and a good time on the water, here are a few ideas for the coming year.



- Go fishing with someone new, like a friend, guide, tournament partner, or family member: Face it. We all get set in our ways and pretty much fish the same way most of the time. Fishing with someone else (especially in their boat on their lake) will likely open your eyes to a number of things you've been missing. Not only will you learn a few new tricks or patterns; in addition, spending a day on the water is a great way to make new friendships or renew friendships with old pals. Other great ways to learn are booking a guide trip or by signing up as a non-boater in a fishing tournament. Nothing helps me learn a new lure or pattern quicker than watching a fishing partner use it to catch a lot of big bass.
- Take a young person fishing: While you might not agree on hairstyles, clothing, or music; you'll both enjoy reeling in fish. And what young folks lack in fishing experience, they make up for in exuberance and curiosity. Watching a kid catch a big fish is exciting for all parties involved and reminds me of when I fell in love with the sport. Plus, a young person's lack of knowledge of the bass fishing "rules" often leads to the discovery of hidden patterns on a fishing trip. Leave it to a newbie to rescue a slow trip with acts of fishing heresy such as topwaters on a sunny day, casting out to the middle of the lake, or pink spinnerbaits.

Taking a relative or neighbor kid is great. Furthermore, youth organizations like the Boy Scouts are always in need of volunteers and fishing from a bass boat with a seasoned angler like you might be a once in a lifetime opportunity for them to get hooked on fishing.

- Try new places: We want to catch bass during our trips, so most of our time is spent fishing our favorite spots on our favorite lakes. While that often fills our livewells, it does little to increase our understanding as anglers and gives us limited options if bass won't bite in the same old honey holes. If you have access to a variety of lakes in your area, go try a new one. You'll be forced to read the conditions and react to the fish on that given day. Although the fishing may be tough at first, nothing is more rewarding than figuring out a pattern and solving the fishing puzzle for that given day. Or if you are on a familiar lake, force yourself to fish new areas. Not only will you learn from figuring out the pattern in the new places, but you'll also have extra honey holes for future fishing trips.
- Experiment with new lures & techniques: Fish become conditioned to lures, especially when you cast the same baits in the same colors and the same sizes to the same spots all the time. Fishing on a daily basis, I see firsthand how quickly (See Pack of Knowledge Continued on Page 22-A)
