2013 Toyota Texas Bass Classic Scheduled for Oct. 4-6 at Lake Conroe World Championship of Bass Fishing Moves to Lake Fork in Spring 2014 and features double event qualification

Toyota Texas Bass Classic officials announced this year's dates for the World Championship of Bass Fishing, scheduled for Oct. 4-6, 2013 at Lake Conroe; and after five years at Conroe, the 2014 TTBC will return to Lake Fork, the inaugural host site, May 9-11, 2014.

host over the past four years," Tournament Director Lenny Francoeur said. "We have an amazing partnership and we're excited to return to Conroe again in October. We are also excited to return to Lake Fork, an historic Texas bass fishery where the community was so welcoming the first time around." Dave Terre, Chief of

Management & Research for the Texas Parks & Wildlife Department Inland Fisheries Division added, "This year we will celebrate an unprecedented fifth consecutive year at Lake Conroe, an area where we've reached many milestones including record attendance, a first-ever over-

for the TPWD youth and outdoor programs," Terre said. "Additionally, we're excited to be able to further increase the awareness of the state's great bass fisheries with a return to Lake Fork in 2014."

Currently, anglers qualify for TTBC through the Angler of the Year points race in the Bassmaster Elite Series, Walmart FLW Tour and Bass Pro Shops PAA Tournament Series, four sponsor exemptions and the prior year champion. With the 2014 move, anglers will qualify for both tournaments with the 2013 Angler of the Year races, adding an extra element of competition - missing out on the 2013 TTBC would eliminate an angler from the tournament until 2015.

"With having double event qualification, it makes each and every point available on each respective Tour that much more valuable," Francoeur said. "Anglers who compete at TTBC are the best of the best and to come here and win is truly something special. Earning the chance to compete in the event twice in one season is something we know will give the anglers extra motivation for this year."

Anglers that qualify for the Toyota Texas Bass Classic join a prestigious rank of past competitors. By drawing from all three major tours, the Toyota Texas Bass Classic field consistently

time fish-off and helped raise over \$1.5 million boasts the best anglers in the world. The 2012 TTBC anglers had a combined 177 total wins, 15 Angler of the Year wins, 15 world championship winners and almost \$75 million in prize money.

Thrift won the 2012 TTBC by a staggering 9 pounds, 4 ounces for a total weight of 53 pounds, 4 ounces.

> After a successful and delicious first year, TTBC officials are also pleased to announce the return of the TTBC BBQ Cook-Off. For the third year in a row, tickets to TTBC will be free and available at www.toyotatexasbassclassic. com later this year. The BBO Cook-Off, daily tournament weigh-ins, outdoor expo and concerts will take place at the Lone Star Convention and Expo Center, making the Toyota Texas Bass Classic a destination for families, fishing enthusiasts and country music fans to enjoy. The 2013 concert lineup will be released later in the year, and last year's musical acts included country superstars Dierks Bentley, Gary Allan and Jake Owen.

Anglers will compete on Lake Conroe over three days, October 4-6, 2013, with the field being reduced to the top-10 for the final round on Sunday, October 6. The tournament will remain a non-entry fee event and all 50 competing anglers will receive guaranteed prize money. Through a continued partnership with the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD), TTBC will continue to its focus on conservation efforts and adhere to a strict catch, weigh and immediate release format. Over the last six years, the Toyota Texas Bass Classic has donated over \$1.5 million to the TPWD, an effort that will continue again this year.

The Lone Star Convention & Expo Center is a state-of-the-art facility conveniently located minutes from Lake Conroe and The Woodlands and only 40 minutes north of Houston. Edward Parten Tapped for Induction into Texas Freshwater Fishing Hall of Fame

Edward Parten of Kingwood, owner of a construction firm, has been selected as the 2013 inductee into the Texas Freshwater Fishing Hall of Fame.

He will be formally inducted into the Hall of Fame at a banquet at the Texas Freshwater Fisheries Center in Athens on June 1.

Parten was a charter member of Texas Black Bass Unlimited and held several offices in that organization, including president, board member and political liaison. In the latter capacity he represented the interests of Texas anglers numerous times in testimony before the Texas Legislature.

Parten was also a member and officer in the Texas Association of Bass Clubs and was founder and president of the Sensible Management of Aquatic Resources Team, which advocated the use of mechanical control of nuisance aquatic vegetation instead of the use of chemicals. He also served as environmental director of the Texas B.A.S.S. Federation Nation, tournament director for the East Texas chapter of the B.A.S.S. Federation Nation and tournament director for Angler's Choice, and is a committee member of the Texas State Bass Tournament, the oldest bass tournament in the world.

Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD), serving several terms on that organization's Freshwater Advisory Board. He worked with TPWD on such issues as possession limits, the freshwater fishing stamp and grass carp control. He also worked on fish habitat improvement projects on a number of Texas reservoirs and helped raise funds for projects at the Texas Freshwater Fisheries Center.

"I don't believe I ever went to a meeting anywhere in Texas to discuss important fisheries issues that Ed wasn't there," Durocher said. "We could always count on his help with a project or with the legislature. 'Big Ed' is certainly deserving of this honor."

The Texas Freshwater Fishing Hall of Honors Parten has received for his efforts Fame is housed at the Texas Freshwater Fisheries Center in Athens. Its mission is to "recognize and honor those who have made a lasting contribution to freshwater fishing in Texas, and to foster a sense of appreciation, awareness and participation in the sport of fishing."

> In addition to the Hall of Fame, the Texas Freshwater Fisheries Center includes a visitor center, production hatchery, stocked casting pond, wetlands trail, fishing museum and dive theater. It is the home of the Toyota ShareLunker program, which uses selective breeding to increase the number and size of trophy bass in Texas public waters.



February Bassin on Lake Fork

Well here we go folks. We are already through January and it is February 2013.

Last year was a blast and I am so thankful to God for each blessing He gave and His mercy. I am really looking forward to this season. You know time is flying by and a few fish are already being caught up in the shallows on red lipless crankbaits and jigs. This time of year even though the water is cooler, a good number of fish will go ahead and move shallow in search of sun and forage. During the day baitfish and crawfish will inhabit the shallows along the weedlines up the lake and around the wooded points leading into the creek channels.



Last month we received a good bit of rain and the lake actually came up a good bit. I would say nearly a foot. That means a lot as it floods more cover and makes the water higher along the weedlines. If we get another big rain like the last one, hopefully it will come up another foot. This will make it even better! I really look forward to this time of year as the fish begin to move more and more as we slowly head toward spring time.

Some of the biggest fish we catch all year is in late January and February. Use your red or crawfish colored lipless crankbaits as your search bait. Once you find an area where you are catching a few fish, go back through with the jig and flip every piece of cover you can see and fish down the edge of the grass if there is some in the area you are fishing. Fish will begin to group up a little and sometimes those mega giants hang out in pairs. On the lipless crankbaits go with the Sebille Flatt shad and on the jig, you know you have to throw the ole trusty Stanley Jig. For the jig trailer I like to use the Berkley Power Bait Chigger Chunk or Chigger Craw. Another good one is the new Berkley Havoc Pit Boss or the new Chunk. Black and blue on the jig is always a consistent fish catching color.

I need to tell you about some new equipment on



the market that I am so excited about. ABU Garcia, the reel of choice for serious anglers around the world, has redesigned and improved the Revo line of reels. Just when I thought they couldn't get any better, they hit the market with the best reels I have ever put in my hand. I have been using the SX model and man they are awesome. I can't wait to get my hands on one of the new Premiers either. They are lighter and cast a long, long way. They are simply a blast to fish with. I have these new

Revo reels mounted on the all new Fenwick Aetos rods. These new rods by Fenwick are incredible. Game Warden Named Texas "Officer of the Year" **Conservation** Association by

Texas Game Warden Ryan Hunter has been named Texas "Officer of the Year" by the Southeastern Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies.

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department Director Carter Smith presented the award to Hunter at the quarterly meeting of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission recently.

Hunter began his career with TPWD on Jan. 4, 2010 as a member of the 55th cadet class at the Texas Game Warden Training Academy. Since graduation that summer, he has been assigned to Moore and Sherman counties in the Texas Panhandle.

As a state game warden, Ryan has encountered a variety of law enforcement scenarios.

"His strong work ethic, positive attitude and professional demeanor have served him well when working with fellow employees and constituents," Smith said of Hunter.

When a child was sexually assaulted, Hunter and his wife were called on to assist the Texas Rangers with the investigation. Ryan's wife volunteered as an interpreter and the couple provided temporary housing for the child until the family members could be located by Child Pro-

After recognizing that hunting and fishing violations were excessively high among the Burmese residents in his area, Hunter collaborated with the community to conduct outreach events dealing with hunting and fishing regulations in their native language. Since then, violations have declined substantially.

In another case, when he received information from a National Park Service ranger about possible illegal fishing activity on Lake Meredith, Hunter and the ranger were able to apprehend four individuals who had used a homemade gill net to catch more than 200 pounds of catfish, walleye and carp. After further investigation, the subjects were linked to an illegal fish selling/ purchasing operation.

Hunter also handled a case involving the illegal sale of game animal meat. After working with other law enforcement agencies for several weeks, the suspect was brought to justice.

Warden Hunter has also been recognized as the Public Service/Involvement Officer of the Year by the Moore County 4-H for his community outreach efforts involving local youth.

His efforts, along with other public service and

law enforcement personnel, helped bring to life a Law Enforcement Explorers Club for youth and young adults in the Moore County area.

A magna cum laude graduate of Hardin-Simmons University in Abilene, Hunter is currently pursuing a master's degree in criminal justicepublic safety.

\$1.33 million in Local Outdoor Grants to Benefit Texas Communities

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission on Thursday approved \$1.3 million in competitive grants for city and county parks across the state, funding 12 out of 35 funding requests.

Money for the 10 Outdoor Recreation Grants and 2 Urban Outdoor Recreation Grants comes from the federal Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF). Program funding is appropriated annually by Congress. TPWD is the pass-through agency for local governments in Texas.

The city of Belton in Bell County was granted \$100,000 to support its proposal to acquire 3.26 acres by donation and develop Nolan Creek, south/southeast to Confederate Park. The proposal includes trails, picnic tables, horseshoe court, exercise stations, two acres of open space, creek improvements for kayak/canoe use, amphitheater, landscaping, and interpretive signs.

Granite Shoals in Burnet County was granted \$100,000 to develop Quarry Park in the north area of the city on FM1431 and Phillips Ranch Road. The proposal includes trails, a tennis pavilion, wildflower gardens and an interpretive display.

The Sonterra Municipal Utility District southeast of Jarrell in Williamson County was granted \$100,000 to support its request to obtain 4.6 acres by donation and develop north and south parks in the east area of the district. The proposal includes game tables, picnic tables with grills, benches, playground, trail with solar lighting, community gardens with drop irrigation, trees and trash cans.


The city of Center in Smith County was granted \$100,000 to support its proposal to acquire 19.68 acres and further develop Center Park in the west area of the city on Roughrider Drive. The proposal includes walking and nature trails, pavilion/ restroom with picnic tables and grills, open play area with landscaping and benches, lighted softball fields, playground, and interpretive signs.

Hays County will receive a grant of \$100,000 to support its proposal to acquire 31.5 acres and develop the Jacob's Well Natural Area north/ northwest of Wimberley. The proposal includes the development of an outdoor classroom, three-acre natural area dedication, playscape, crushed granite trail, interpretive signs/kiosk, five picnic

tables, five benches, two wildlife/bird blinds, rainwater collection, two bike racks and native plant restoration.

The city of La Feria in Cameron County was granted \$100,000 to support its proposal to develop Unger Park on 330 S. West Street. The proposal includes one covered picnic unit with water catchment, two uncovered picnic tables made of recycled materials, multi-court, practice soccer field, basketball court with fence, playground equipment, climber, volley ball court, trail, three benches, barbeque pit, horseshoes, shuffleboard, four concrete sitting balls, walkway, exercise equipment, aquatic spray feature, solar and energy efficient security lighting, landscaping, native trees, drip irrigation and signs.

In northwest Corpus Christi in Nueces County, a grant of \$100,000 will be used to support acquisition of 12 acres and develop Lyondell Basell Park located on Haven Drive. The proposal includes a basketball half-court, playground, trail, exercise stations, picnic tables with grills, xeriscape area *(See 1.33 million.....Continued on Page 16-A)*

Big Bend Ranch State Park to Host Third-Annual Chihuahuan Desert Bike Fest

Big Bend Ranch State Park, located in the remote mountain country of far Southwest Texas, is set to host the third-annual Chihuahuan Desert Bike Fest, a challenging three-day mountain bike ride Feb. 14-16, at what many consider to be the up-and-coming premier mountain biking destination in the Southwestern U.S.

Bike Fest 2013, which is co-sponsored by Terlingua-based outfitter Desert Sports, will again feature three full days of guided rides through rugged, exigent desert terrain at the 300,000-acre plus state park, Big Bend National Park, and on the Lajitas Trail system. Numerous guided and unguided ride opportunities are scheduled each of the three days, led by veteran riders from Texas Parks and Wildlife Dept. and Desert Sports/Big Bend Trails Alliance.

Highlighting the event's agenda again will be the signature, 58-mile EPIC ride (as designated by the International Mountain Biking Association) scheduled for Saturday, Feb. 16, onto which bikers can elect to extend an additional 12 miles (covering 70 miles total). There's also a two-day EPIC ride option, with an overnight stay and meals at the park's Sauceda bunkhouse.

There will also be daily forays along the state park's 30-plus-mile Rincon Loop, Chimney Rock Cut Across, Dome Loop and Contrabando trails, all of which are popular routes because of their single-track trails, vivid desert scenery, and historical points of interest. In addition, park staff has added additional rides for this year's event, such as the Rock House Tour, a 21-mile course led by a park ranger that ventures off the beaten path to some of Big Bend Ranch's natural and cultural features like 100-plus-year-old ruins. And a "Geo-Ride" has been added, which is a self-guided geocache tour for bikers who like to use their GPS skills.

Water stations with drinking and potable water are located at various intervals along the trails for Bike Fest, and trained park staff and volunteers will be on hand for each ride. Even so, all riders should bring ample supplies of water, and do some advanced prep and training. Participants are encouraged to read the "Gear List" on the Desert Sports event website and be fully equipped before heading to Chihuahuan Desert Bike Fest: http://www.desertsportstx.com/mountain-bike-event/suggestedgear-list/

"We're telling riders to bring at least two or three liters of water per person, per day, sunscreen, and at least two self-sealing bike tubes, as a minimum," said Dan Sholly, deputy director of Texas State Parks. "This country is gorgeous, but it can be unforgiving if you're not prepared. It is critical to have tubeless bike tires or self-sealing tubes."

Although most of Bike Fest's rides are geared for advanced mountain bike enthusiasts, the park also offers shorter, ranger-led rides of 10-11 miles for strong beginner and low-intermediate level bikers who have the conditioning to ride 11 miles of relatively flat terrain. A kid's ride is also scheduled for Friday and Saturday as well.

"While there are many challenging trails in the state park, there are also a number of double-track sections, which are great for beginning-level mountain bikers who are physically fit and equipped with appropriate gear and water," said Sholly

The primary staging area for Chihuahuan Desert Bike Fest will again be the comfortable Lajitas Golf Resort and Spa, and Maverick Ranch RV Park, also in Lajitas. Both are strategically located along FM 170 near the event's daily trail head start and the state park's Barton Warnock Visitor Center.

Fun won't just be limited to the two-wheel variety; each evening there'll be live music, swimming, hula-hoop dancing, dining in Terlingua, and other activities. Bike manufacturing / company reps will also be on hand with a fleet of demo bikes for riders to try out on the trails. In all, last year, nearly 300 riders participated in Bike Fest, and more are expected for this year's event. Proceeds from Bike Fest will benefit the Big Bend Trails Alliance.





Black bear activity on the upswing in the Hill Country and South Texas

Black bear activity in the Hill Country and South Texas along the Rio Grande from Del Rio to below Laredo is increasing, according to Texas Parks and Wildlife Department biologists.

Though historically it has been very rare for bears to be sighted south or east of Val Verde County, in 2012 there were a dozen such sightings.

"This is likely a result of a growing number of bears in Mexico dispersing and searching for food after severe droughts and wildfires," says TPWD biologist Jonah Evans of Alpine, the department's bear coordinator. "Whether these sightings signify a permanent recolonization of Central and South Texas remains to be seen."

While black bears are native to all of Texas, in the early 1900's, heavy hunting and trapping completely eliminated them from the state. Currently, the only established breeding populations are in the Big Bend area of West Texas.

"Black bears are generally not a risk to humans," Evans says. "But they can become a nuisance if they gain a taste for human food, pet food, or trash. We've recently received several reports of bears tipping over and damaging deer feeders and a few raiding trash cans along the border."

Evans says the department's goal is for people and bears to coexist peacefully.

"By eliminating food rewards, we eliminate most of the problems," he says. "Many communities in bear country have effectively adapted to live with

The most effective strategy is for residents along the border to secure their trash, bird feeders, and pet food, so bears don't become habituated to easy meals, Evans notes.

"This cannot be overstated," he continues. "The saying 'A fed bear is a dead bear' is absolutely true. If a bear becomes habituated and food-conditioned, there is little we can do to save it. It will likely have to be destroyed."

TPWD is asking for people to report all bear sightings. If a bear is causing a nuisance, TPWD will work with residents to secure attractants and may attempt to haze the bear. In extreme situations, the bear may be relocated. Biologists are also available to give talks and educational programs on living with bears. Since black bears are a threatened species in Texas, they cannot be legally hunted or harmed.





Multiple Indictments Returned in State Game Warden Hostage Case_

An Upshur County grand jury has returned named in five felony indictments, includ- in at the Upshur County Jail a short time multiple felony indictments, including two first degree counts of aggravated assault on a police officer, naming a father and son accused of holding a state game warden at gunpoint last October.

All the indictments stem from an Oct. 6 incident in which Texas Parks and Wildlife Department Game Warden Shane Bailev was disarmed and detained by two armed men while the officer was making a routine check for hunting law violations on private property in Upshur County.

The warden used his cell phone to call for help, and soon numerous local and state officers came to his assistance and ended the situation with no shots fired.

Lloyd Allen Crabtree, 51, a former county commissioner in Upshur County, was

ing three counts of aggravated assault on a peace officer (first degree felony); one count of taking a weapon from a peace officer (third degree felony) and one count the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department of unlawful restraint with a deadly weapon Internal Affairs Unit and the Texas Rang-(third degree felony).

Crabtree's son, Todd A. Crabtree, 28, was indicted on three felony charges: One the part of our Internal Affairs officers, count of aggravated assault on a peace officer (first degree felony); one count of taking a weapon from a peace officer (third degree felony); and one count of unlawful TPWD's Law Enforcement Division direcrestraint with a deadly weapon (third degree felony).

"Pack of Knowledge" Jigs for Springtime Lunkers-Part I

By Tom Redington

For catching the largest bass that swim on your favorite waterway, it's hard to beat a jig in the winter and prespawn. Although it is such a simple bait, I've spent the better part of two decades trying to master it. I still miss more jig hits than I'd like, but the skills I've learned have resulted in many big bass for me, including my biggest ever, a 12 lb 5 oz prespawn bruiser. Furthermore, many of my best tournament stringers over the years



214-683-9572 www.lakeforkguidetrips.com have come on a jig, so it is definitely worth investing the time to hone your skills with this bait.

I start by choosing a jig to match the depth and cover that I'll be fishing. While there are a number of specialized jigs to cover every application from fishing rocky shores to punching grass mats, I normally start with a general purpose flipping jig that allows me to fish both wood cover and to work deep weedlines. My preference is the Lake Fork Trophy Lures MPack jig. Its head is shaped to come through cover well, then rotate in a fish's jaws to almost always hook them in the roof of the mouth. In addition, a big strong hook is required when pulling monster bass out of heavy cover in the spring, and the magnum Gamakatsu hook on this jig is razor sharp and ultra-strong. With a strong rod, heavy line and a short pitch cast, jigs with inferior hooks will flex and not penetrate in the bony mouth of lunker bass. Depending on the day, I'll fish anywhere from a $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ oz size jig. I normally start with the 1/2 oz size, but I'll cover weight selection more in Part II.

Once you have selected a jig, it isn't complete until you add a trailer. Your choice of trailer will alter the size, profile, color, drop speed, & cover penetrating ability of your jig. If I'm pitching to specific targets like stumps, docks, or laydowns, I want a streamlined trailer that will drop straight down instead of gliding away from the target. Furthermore, streamlined baits hurry down and are more effective for bass that are relating to the bottom. When I want a streamlined trailer, I normally go with a Fork Craw and I'll remove the legs and antennae to make it more compact. Other times, the slower, gliding fall of larger, flatter trailers work well, especially for bass suspended in grass or wood cover. In addition, the flat surface allows you to skip jigs more effectively under docks and overhanging branches. Plastic pork chunk style baits like Pig Claws are the kings of gliding and skipping. To slow the rate of fall and get a lot of action, creature baits like Flippers or Hyper Freaks as a trailer give a jig ultimate action.

After making these choices, we come to always controversial topic of color. Although color sometimes makes a world of difference, in general, springtime jig fishing seems to be more about lure placement and presentation than hitting on the perfect color. In fact, in winter and early prespawn, I almost exclusively go with the traditional black and blue combinations. It'll work well in both clear and muddy water and on cloudy or sunny days. Once the water warms up later in spring, color seems to matter a bit more. In clearer water and on brighter days, try natural colors like pump-






kinseed, green pumpkin or watermelon. In your jig on, and here's dirtier water and on cloudier days, dark jigs in blacks, browns, and purples are often better, especially with a little splash of a bright color like chartreuse, red, or orange. Most folks meticulously match their trailer to their jig. While that often works well, I've had great results with some pretty obnoxious contrasting colors. For instance, a black blue jig with a green pumpkin or watermelon red trailer is one of my favorites, as is a peanut butter & jelly jig with a watermelon candy trailer. Experiment until you find what works for you on a given day.

Now it's time to tie where technology makes jig fishing more efficient. New fluorocarbon and braided lines are much more sensitive and abrasion resistant, allowing you to feel light bites and then winch lunkers out of tight spots. In heavy grass and wood, 50 to 65 lb braid is hard to


beat Unless I'm in dense cover, I prefer to tip my braid with a 6' to 9' leader of 20 to 30 lb fluorocarbon for reduced visibility to the bass. In open water situations, 10 to 20 lb fluorocarbon as the main line is nearly as sensitive as braid and stealthier, when ultra-(See Pack of Knowledge... Continued on Page 22-A)

high abrasion resistance isn't required.

Finally, you'll need to rig this all up on a lightweight and sensitive rod & reel. I prefer high speed 7:1 bait casting reels because they are more efficient by allowing me to quickly reel in after


for the rod, I look for several attributes. A wellbalanced stick allows you to fish it all day, and a sensitive rod with a fast tip will help detect those light bites (and the bites from the big fish are usually the lightest). Meanwhile, the rod needs to working a stump and then fire to the next one. As have a lot of power to pull out big fish, yet retain





enough of a tip to pitch or roll cast the jig accurately. Personally, I've found the Dobyns Extreme rods to be perfect for jig fishing because they are as sensitive as any rod I've ever used. While you don't need a sensitive rod for topwater or spinnerbait fishing, feel is paramount in jig fishing and this is the one category of rods that you should buy the best you can afford. I normally opt for the DX745 model, a 7'4" rod that's rated Mag Heavy. If the cover is lighter and I'm using fluorocarbon and smaller jigs, the slightly less



powerful DX744 model is a Heavy power rod and

has enough tip to cast the lighter baits. In either

case, 7' and longer rods really help make longer

pitches and then give you more control over big
