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
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TPWD Game Warden Field Notes

The following items are compiled from recent Texas everything that goes on and left it at that. The man re-Parks and Wildlife Department law enforcement reports.

-- Drifting Away... Two Val Verde County game wardens responded to a distress call involving a small child trapped in a drifting boat. The boat had drifted into the middle of Lake Amistad with a 7-year-old child, and the family was unable to retrieve it. The wardens quickly responded with their patrol boat, found the vessel and reunited the young boy with a very grateful family.

-- The All-Knowing Game Warden... A Floyd/ Hale County game warden saw the driver of a pickup truck shoot a .22 rifle into a wheat field across the street about 30 feet away from where he was stationed. While the warden tried to get a license plate number, the vehicle took off and stopped about 100 yards down the road. The driver then fired another shot into the field. The warden took off in the direction of the vehicle and caught up to the driver a few miles down the road. The driver admitted to shooting grackles in the field and did not seem happy to be stopped. He then told the warden he knew what he was doing was wrong and that he should go find a real criminal. The driver then asked the warden how he knew that he was the one who had shot off the road and wanted to know who told on him. The warden politely let the individual know that he sees

ceived a citation for hunting from a public roadway.

--Fishing for Trouble... A Hemphill County game warden and an Ochiltree County game warden observed a group of nine people in a remote section of Palo Duro Lake, upstream from the main lake in an area that is rarely used recreationally. Undetected, the two wardens approached the group on foot and saw various actions associated with possible illegal fishing activity. After watching the group for a while, the wardens split up and approached the group from opposite directions. When the wardens announced their presence, the group scattered and the wardens saw that one of the men was carrying a scoped black rifle. After several tense moments, the wardens were able to talk to the man and got him to put down the rifle. When the group was rounded back up, nine individuals from Oklahoma were found to be in possession of various types of fish, including 24 under-size crappie and 5 undersize channel cats. These were removed, measured, photographed and released.

--Swim at Your Own Risk... A Lubbock County game warden and a Deaf Smith/Castro/Parmer county game warden were patrolling Buffalo Springs Lake when they noticed two young girls trying to swim across the lake in an area with very heavy boat traffic. Both girls appeared to be very exhausted and were struggling to stay above water. The wardens

quickly responded as one of the girls went underwater for an extended amount of time. The girl then surfaced as the patrol boat arrived at their location. Both girls were rescued and pulled aboard the patrol boat, then delivered safely to the shore. The wardens then took a moment to educate the very grateful girls about the dangers of trying to swim across the lake.

-- Handy Fishing... A Smith County game warden was patrolling boat ramps around Lake Palestine when he saw three people in the water hand fishing. A fourth man was on the bank putting fish in the truck and watching the parking lot. The warden watched the fisherman from the bushes for about 45 minutes. When the last man came out of the water, he eased a snag pole to the man who was looking out, who quickly put the pole on the back of the truck. The warden made contact with the group and tickets were issued for no fishing licenses and for taking fish by illegal means and methods. The fish were returned to the water.

-- Abandon Ship... A Grayson County game warden was checking striper fishermen on Lake Texoma when he noticed smoke coming from a boat about three quarters of a mile away. The warden notified the local fire department and approached the boat. Two people had stopped their 16-foot jet boat and noticed smoke coming from the engine cover. The boaters

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Strollin' With Stroman _

One thing you can count on during the dog days of summer is it is going to be hot in the morning, afternoon and night. Bring plenty of water, sunscreen, polarized glasses and be ready for some big bass action. Another thing you can count on is feeding time. When you start catching bass at certain times on a certain spot you can count on them being there the next day, same time and location.

Mid-day and late afternoon is when the bite is at its best. The hotter it is the better the bite. Big schools of shad start grouping during midday heat and start moving around to find a better comfort zone. When they

stay too close to humps, ridges, ledges and main lake points bass will start eating shad and gorging themselves.


Look for surface activity on top, shad or bass bursting on top. If there is no activity on top, but you are marking schools of shad on or near humps or ridges, stay in the area. Bass will not be far behind. When vou notice surface activity on top, soft weightless jerk baits in white or shad patterns are hard to beat. When the shad are deep over structure, Carolina-rigged plastics and big spoons are top lure choices.

The reason early morning bite is slow during the dog days of summer is that by the time it starts breaking day most (See Strollin with Stroman ...

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Refreshing, Easy Recipe For Warm Weather

From mixed greens to pasta supreme, summer days just aren't complete without a heaping bowl of salad. Maybe it's because they are so light and tasty that these simple dishes complement a day around the pool. However, be sure to experiment with as many salad recipes as you can to fill the 90 or so days the warm weather lasts.

For a tasty and fresh flavor that will work well for entertaining, try "Tuna-Pepper Salad." Using fresh tuna in the recipe will yield amazing results, just in time

for National Salad Week (July 25 to 31) or any time you desire a tasty and light summer dish.

Tuna-Pepper Salad (Serves 6 to 8)

Fresh tuna that has been steamed or grilled and then flaked for salad tastes nothing like its canned cousin found at fresh tarragon the market. While this fish isn't always available fresh, this salad will make the most of it when it's in season. This is an excellent luncheon dish that can be prepared in advance for guests. Sliced oranges, tangerines and seedless red grapes complement the tuna, pepper and herb medley with a tangy sweetness and contrast. Add 2 cups of cooked tomato or spinach penne for a heartier dish.

1- 8-ounce tuna steak, grilled and cooled 1 orange or red bell pepper, finely chopped 1 cup seeded and finely chopped green olives

4 stalks celery, diced 1 tablespoon minced fresh chives

2 tablespoons minced

½ cup extra-virgin olive

1 teaspoon white wine vinegar

Salt & freshly ground pepper, to taste

Place the tuna in a large bowl and gently break it into chunky flakes with a fork

Add the peppers, olives and celery and toss. Blend in the chives and tarragon. Add the oil and vinegar and blend into the salad with the fork to coat all of the ingredients. Season with salt and pepper.

Note: This salad stores well in the refrigerator for two to three days.

Food and beverages will be available for purchase, and people are encouraged to bring picnics. KCKL (FM 95.9) will broadcast patriotic music during the show.




