

Crappie Anglers of Texas – Texas State Crappie Championship of Lake Fork

CAT recently held its 11th Texas State Crappie Championship Tournament on Lake Fork on October 12-13, 2018. This was a two-day tournament. Even with changing fish patterns and torrential rains, anglers brought impressive and record-breaking stringers to the scales. Division 1 had 25 qualifying teams enter the championship and Division 2 had 18 teams. Here are the results:

In Division 1, David Gibby (Valley View, TX) and Cody Standerfer (Prosper, TX) won first place with a two-day total of 14 fish weighing 27.64 pounds. This broke the record for the largest two-day string caught during a Texas State Crappie Championship. Second place was won by Clay Gann (Hideaway, TX) and Todd Froebe (Lindale, TX) with junior angler Landon Froebe with 14 fish weighing 26.66 pounds. Kelly Satterwhite (Teague, TX) and Eric Walker (Lewisville, TX) took home 3rd place with 14 fish weighing 26.43 pounds. Other awards - Pro Angler Elite Rod Challenge Award Day 1 winners were Chris Waters

and Kirk Grounds (13.93). David Gibby and Cody Standerfer (14.14) won Day 2. Bobby Garland Big Fish Award Day 1 winners were Weston Belcher and Brain Carter (2.63). David Gibby and Cody Standerfer (2.67) won.

In Division 2, Brandon Miles (Bullard, TX) and Steve Goncalves (Midlothian, TX) won first place with a two-day total of 14 fish weighing 24.30 pounds. Miles and Goncalves capped off incredible season with a with a Championship win. Second place was won by Bob McAffrey (Killeen, TX) and Greg Young (Weatherford, TX) 13 fish weighing 24.02 pounds. Brent Bryson (Leonard, TX) and Mikie Bryson (Leonard, TX) took home 3rd place with 14 fish weighing 22.37 pounds. Other awards -Pro Angler Elite Rod Challenge Award winners for both days were Brandon Miles and Steve Goncalves (13.12 and 11.18). Bobby Garland Big Fish Award Day 1 winners were Bran-McAffrey and Greg Young (2.29) won Day 2. site

The annual awards banquet was held at the Emory Civic Center October 12, 2018. The team of Clay Gann and Todd Froebe won the "Anglers of the Year" honor in Division 1, and the team of Brandon Miles and Steve Goncalves were named "Anglers of the Year" in Division 2. The prestigious 2018 Ron Conatser Sportsman of the Year award was presented to Robert Russell and the 2018 "Top CAT" Award was posthumously awarded to Matthew Carroll.








November is Big Bass Month On Fork

your umbrella. What a wet start this years fall season. On queue, this years lake turnover has been at full throttle and the lake should start to stabilize as we roll into one of the best big bass months, November. Fork has risen about two feet recently which has thrown a wrench in the big bass hunt. As the lake settles down, let's review our options to land a true giant.

The water quality overall is in great condition and the backs of some creeks have great visibility. Otherwise, water clarity ranges from somewhat clear down south to lightly stained in the backs of the main

creeks that feed the lake. How you approach the bass will depend upon where " If you step outside, be sure to bring you prefer to fish and how far down in the water you can see your lure before it disappears. With this in mind, the shallow bite is ramping up and big bass can be caught in all parts of the lake. Let's start the morning searching for top water fish. Shallow vegetation is key to your success and now that the water is back up, bank grass, milfoil, alligator grass and hydrilla will dominate the skinny water. In extreme off color water, use a noisy bait that stirs up the water. Prop baits are excellent choices in this case. If the water is only slightly stained in the backs of the creeks and pockets, tie on a Zara Spook, Yellow Magic or a Sammy and start covering water. Shad are also moving to the backs of these areas and big bass are right on their tail. Focus on using shad colors on most any lure you throw and hang on for some jolting strikes. Pick out secondary points or small points of vegetation. All should hold fish. Also, don't be afraid to chunk a Spro frog around any vegetation you encounter. Huge bass can't resist the way they move through the wa-



As the sun eases it's way higher into the sky, switch your strategy to baits that descend into the water column. If the water is heavily stained, throw the chatterbait, spinnerbait or squarebill in the same areas. If the water is slightly stained, use a five inch swimbait, swimjig or chatterbait. Hydrilla or milfoil will change the game slightly, use a lipless crankbait and key on the outer edges of the grass. As the water temps degrades throughout the month, switch your lipless colors to gold or red. Now that you have photo's of several great fish during the morning, migrate your

Public Notice on Outbreaks of Avian Paramyxovirus in Texas

Recently, a number of Eurasian collared doves near El Paso have tested positive for avian paramyxovirus, specifically Pigeon Paramyxovirus-1, or PPMV-1. Dead doves have also been reported in Alpine.

Past outbreaks have been observed in the vicinity of many of the larger urban centers of the Trans-Pecos and Panhandle regions such as Midland, Lubbock, and Alpine, but outbreaks may occur elsewhere within these regions. The majority of PPMV-1 outbreaks in wild birds in the United States have involved Eurasian collared doves and rock doves (pigeons).

Symptoms include doves becoming le-

thargic and reluctant to move, producing green diarrhea, or having difficulty in standing or holding their head upright. The virus can cause conjunctivitis (pink eye) in humans, therefore, if you encounter multiple dead or dying doves, do not handle the birds without hand and eye protection.

There is no known risk to cats or dogs from PPMV-1, but we recommend keeping pets away from infected birds.

Some strains of PPMV-1 have been shown to cause disease and death in domestic poultry. Chickens can contract the disease from indirect contact such as dove feces in chicken feeding areas. Therefore, back-

yard chicken owners may want to take precautions to minimize potential contact between chickens and doves.

If an outbreak occurs in your area, the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department recommends discontinuing bird feeding and watering activities to decrease possible transmission between doves and other birds. If multiple sick or dying doves are located in your area, please contact a local TPWD biologist or Don Kahl (don.kahl@ tpwd.texas.gov; 475-1308). Additionally, please advise the use of protective gloves, masks, and glasses if handling sick or dying birds in these areas.

"Transition Moon Time

By Terri Moon

The fall transition has begun on FORK! 10-plus inches of rain in the last couple of weeks along with a couple of cold fronts dropping water temperatures has definitely triggered the fall migration up the creeks. I call it the "FALL **FEEDING** FRENZY"! They will be following the baitfish so keep a close eye on that depthfinder and watch for balls of shad and what depth they are moving through. This will tell you what depth you need to target. These depths will change throughout the day so keep monitoring your graph for any depth changes of the active

For those of you thinking about upgrading your graph, don't do anything until you check out Lowrance's latest HDS-LIVE! Its realtime sonar, Structure Scan 3D with active imaging and Live on screen mapping. I've seen some great videos on line of this incredible new unit. So, if you are serious about your fishing, this could be exactly what you're looking

Another thing to monitor is water temps. It has been dropping quickly with all the rains and cold fronts



moving through. Recently it was 66 - 69degrees, and we were finding crappie in 10 – 12 feet of water. But, as water temps drop you will want to check 12 to 25 ft. depths and just keep looking for the baitfish. Target creek channels, deep water humps and drop-offs with access to shallower water. As temps continue to drop, they will make their way back out to main lake points in the deep water. It's always fun catching these crappie in their transition while they are aggressively feeding!

The baits working for us have been Lake Fork Tackles Live Baby Shad in blue and chartreuse, pink and chartreuse, and white and chartreuse. For those of you that like feather jigs, gray/blue tail, purple/yellow tail and orange/blue tail have been working for us.

I'm also liking the 5 ft. crappie rod that Louie Vaughn from Reel Time Rods made

for me! I was sad to see Shimano stopped making my favorite 5 ft. crappie rods – so, Louie offered to make me one. It's sensitive yet has the backbone to handle the giants! Reel Time Rods are located by Popes Landing if any of you are interested in having a custom rod made. They also have reel cleaning and repair!

Now as far as another transition, I've had the pleasure of transitioning into my new Skeeter Solera 205 this month and have enjoyed every minute in it (and so have my customers)! Even my mom and dad were thrilled to fish out of it. It's just so comfortable! We had planned to fish more but it rained all but 2 days the entire time they were here! The 2 days we fished were just beautiful and the big crappie were biting! It was great getting to fish with them again!

Prospects Still Scattered Ahead for Quail Season

This year's quail season opened Saturday, on nesting success, and the recent deluges Oct. 27 like a covey rise, according to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department's experts; everything's up in the air.

TPWD landowner and hunter surveys indicate that quail hunters are likely to limit harvest in poor years. Research supports the practice of self-regulation in quail pastures, so enough breeders remain to boost populations when conditions improve. Landowners/hunters can contact their county biologist for site-specific recommendations and harvest guide-

"This past winter was exceptionally dry across all of quail country, especially in the Rolling Plains where some places went without any precipitation for 100 consecutive days," said Perez. "Unfortunately, these conditions can reduce the availability of foods like winter greens which are needed to get quail into breeding condition. Spring was also dry over much of these areas with few exceptions. Fortunately, quail are opportunistic when it comes to the breeding/nesting season and can take advantage of the rains even if they come late like they did this summer."

TPWD projections are based on annual statewide quail surveys that were initiated in 1978 to monitor quail populations. This index uses randomly selected, 20-mile roadside survey lines to determine annual quail population trends by ecological region. This trend information helps determine relative quail populations among the regions of Texas.

Comparisons can be made between the mean (average) number of quail observed per route this year and the 15-year mean for quail seen within an ecological region. The quail survey was not designed to predict relative abundance for any area smaller than the ecological region.

A regional breakdown of this year's TPWD quail index survey, including highlights and prospects, is available online.

Quail hunting season runs through Feb. 24, 2019. The daily bag limit for quail is 15, with 45 in possession. Legal shooting hours for all non-migratory game birds are 30 minutes before sunrise to 30 minutes after sunset. The bag limit is the maximum number that may be killed during the legal shooting hours in one day.



Lake Fork Sportsmans Association Assisted TPWD in 2018 Restocking Program

Again, the Lake Fork Sportsman's Association (LFSA) assisted the Texas Parks and Wildlife (TPWD) 2018 Pure Florida Large Mouth Bass fingerling release. The Texas Freshwater Fisheries' Athens Hatchery produces fingerlings at the hatchery and TPWD Biologists Kevin Storey (retired) and Evan Cartabiano coordinated the release with the hatchery. By providing resources to help TPWD distribute the fingerlings into the lake, LFSA directly assisted with the release of the fingerlings through improving processes.

LFSA utilized their Live Release Boat (LRB) that is also used consistently for handling fish caught at tournaments all around the lake. Improving the survivability of the fish caught out of Lake Fork is a specific mission of the Association. The LRB has three 100-gallon tanks, oxygen supply, and fish-saving water treatments. LFSA members must complete a training course to develop expertise in handling and distributing the fingerlings. The LRB provides a healthy means to transport the fingerlings for distribution anywhere on the lake. Last year the LRB was utilized for the first time stocking

the upper end of Birch Creek with 100,000+ fingerlings. This year the LRB was used for the delivery of two loads of fingerlings into the upper end of the east arm of the lake. The releases were made with LFSA members and three local residents who had knowledge of great spots with lots of cover for the fingerlings. Approximately 82,700 were released in the Glade Creek Bay area and 69,000 in the Running Creek arm north of the 515 bridge. In 2017, working with TPWD, LFSA developed the first "Bagging Operation" to distribute fingerlings using local volunteers. These volunteers distributed the fingerlings into the lake in areas with good cover to protect the fingerlings with the purpose of significantly improving the survivability of the release. The "Bagging Operation" involved loading plastic bags with treated water, fingerlings (60 -70 per bag) and oxygen. The operation was setup at the public boat ramp off Highway 17 and supported with numerous LFSA members, local volunteers and TPWD. Forty-six individuals from all around the lake volunteered to distribute 6 - 8 bags of fingerlings each in Lake Fork near their local lake site or fishing spot with superior cover for the fingerlings. In 2018 approxi-

mately 37,425 fingerlings were released with the "Bagging Operation". Per TPWD supplied data, a total of 312,050 fingerlings were released in 2018. LFSA enabled the release of approximately 189,200 of the total utilizing the LRB and "Bagging Operation". With a purpose to "Preserve the Legend of Lake Fork", LFSA continues to grow the project with TPWD and Lake Fork residents and fishermen. Support of the program continues to grow for the fingerling release and local residents taking part has a large impact on the

success of the survivability of the fingerlings.



There have been a lot of changes in the past month! A lot of rain and some record breaking low temperatures sure mixed things up out here on Lake Fork. Fishing has been a little tough lately, but that's to be expected dy a given all the abrupt changes.

We have a strong Florida strain bass influence in the gene pool here, and that usually means tough fishing during transitional times. Florida bass like consistency, and that is something we haven't had much of. As things continue to stabilize the bite



should improve. On the bright side, I enjoy the cooler weather and the lake is almost full!

The water level is just a little below full pool. That is up a couple feet since this time last month. The water quality isn't as muddy as you would expect. It is clearing up nicely. The water temperature is in mid to upper 60's as of right now.

There are some fish shallow and some deep, and everywhere in between. I guess you just pick a place and go fishing. I think the shallow fishermen are probably catching the most right now. A look at the Berkley Tournament results show that the "big fish bite" hasn't been too hot. 1151 anglers went at it for two days and only one fish over the slot was weighed. That's the poorest results I've seen in a tournament that size here, ever.

I think November will be better. I normally rank November right up there with the spring time months. I like it. The deep bite is good in November, and this year the shallow water should hold some good ones with the rise in the water level.

I hope this helps give you an idea what is going on out here. As always, if I can be of any assistance feel free to let me know. Let me share a verse that has given me a lot of



haunts, humps, ridges, roadbeds and structure. Fall on Fork has always been great fishing for these patterns during the afternoon hours. Flutter spoons, jigging spoons, Carolina rigs, drop shots and football jigs will be the "go to" baits when you locate bass stacked up on any of these features. Pitch out a marker buoy and go to work. Gold is a great color for the spoons and a ten inch worm will get the job done on the C-rig. Blue fleck, redbug, green pumpkin





Lilly never meets a stranger. She's an outgoing, active little girl who loves to dance.

After Lilly was found to suffer from blood cancer in November 2014, she was airlifted immediately to St. Jude Children's Research. Hospital*, "It all happened so quickly," said Lilly's mom, Jessica.
