White Annual **Bass** Run Looking **Strong** in East **Texas**

Texas should enjoy prime white bass fishing this spring, Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) biologists predict, while results could be spottier in central and south Texas.

Each spring, white bass run upstream from reservoirs into rivers and creeks to spawn, creating prime fishing opportunities for new and seasoned anglers. White bass can be targeted from the bank, motorized boat or paddle craft in multiple publicly accessible locations throughout the state. East Texas could have the most potential this year for anglers to pursue white bass. Heavy rainfalls in late fall and winter increased river levels, water flows and muddied the water. TPWD biologists predict a good year for white bass fishing and in deep east Texas, the Sabine River above Toledo Bend reservoir is the top fishery. Reports indicate large females began to move up-river in mid-January. The Neches River and Kickapoo Creek above

Heavy fall rain will mean anglers in east Lake Palestine offer more prime spots for white conditions could have an impact on the timbass in East Texas. Inland Fisheries staff also recommend staying on Highway 31 and accessing Chambers Creek above Richland Chambers and according to reports, Lake Houston shows promise with good reports coming out of Peach, Caney, and Spring creeks and Luce's Bayou.

Reports indicate recent rainfall and releases from Lake Lavon in north central Texas have triggered the male white bass to head upstream. Hot spots include the East Fork of the Trinity River below Lake Lavon and upstream of Lake Ray Hubbard off State Highway 78. White Bass anglers can also hook into the occasional hybrid striper coming up from Ray Hubbard. Another hot spot is on the Stewart Creek arm of Lake Lewisville where public trails along the creek in Frisco grant access for fishing. In central Texas, the Hill Country and south Texas, the run could be hit and miss due to some rivers and reservoirs currently experiencing low water levels and low flows. These

ing and size of the white bass run. Some well-timed rain events in the coming weeks could change the situation for the better. Early reports from Inland Fisheries Division staff in San Antonio are showing signs that the Nueces River also could be a hot spot this year. Popular runs in the Waco area that could hold promise this year include the South Bosque River and Hog Creek at the southern end of Lake Waco, Nolan River above Pat Cleburne Lake, Cowhouse Creek on the North-West side of Belton, Lampasas River above Stillhouse Hollow Lake, the Brazos above Whitney and Granbury Lakes, the Navasota River above Lake Limestone, Fort Parker State Park Lake and Mexia especially above Lake Limestone. White bass, also known as sand bass, are a

popular freshwater species preferred by Texas anglers both for sport fishing and for the dinner table. While most riverside property is pri-

Reports indicate water flow remains below normal overall, but TPWD staff are hopeful that recent rain events with the potential for more in early spring, will support a good run from Lake Granbury into the upstream section of the river. Neches River: Above Lake Palestine, anglers can find public access at Chandler River Park featured in this TPWD You-Tube Video. This RACA site offers nearly 6,000 feet of river frontage for bank fishing

and includes a boat ramp and kayak launch. rently closed to motorboats) and bank access. Llano River: The Kingsland Slab RV Camp provides access to the river, with 750 feet of river frontage along the Llano River. This RACA) site offers free public fishing access and is located at 7300 River Oaks Dr. in Kingsland. Sabine River: Above Toledo Bend Reservoir in Panola County, anglers can find public access for white bass fishing at the Grand Bluff Boat Ramp, which offers 275 feet of river frontage and a single trailer boat ramp. This RACA site offers free public access to the Black Shoals fishing hole located about 3 miles upstream. Frio River: Above Choke Canyon Reservoir, anglers can find public access points for white bass fishing at county road and highway crossings, including the Highway 99 bridge crossing and boat ramp in McMullen County. Colorado River: Above Lake Buchanan, bank anglers can fish for white bass at Colorado Bend State Park. The park offers a boat ramp (cur-

TPWD recommends that anglers check the water levels and river flows before heading to their favorite location. A variety of artificial lures and flies will work for anglers targeting white bass, including small jigs, crank baits and streamers. Night fishing using lights or around lighted docks can also be effective. White bass are excellent table fare for anglers looking for versatile and healthy source of protein. The daily bag limit for white bass is 25 with a 10-inch minimum length. More information on fishing regulations can be found in the TPWD Outdoor Annual. As always, don't forget to purchase your fishing license unless exempt. Funds from the sale of fishing licenses are used to make fishing better by supporting TWPD hatcheries and fish stockings, fish habitat enhancement, fisheries management, outreach activities and more. 




"March on Lake Fork Means Action!"

It's the start of the busiest couple of months here. So, keep that in consideration for your trips in pursuit of the fantastic Largemouth Bass that Lake Fork has to offer. Safety and patience are essential as we go about enjoy-

ing our favorite lake on Earth.

March will have the first wave of Bass to push shallow to Spawn, but will also have opportunities for fantastic Pre-Spawn Bass fishing. With the lake up, the shallow male bass are already on the inside of the grass lines. Your favorite confidence soft plastic lure on a Texas Rig on the banks and shallow cover will get you bit, but finding the certain stretches that contain them is key. Once you do, cycle back through. This month when you locate male bass, the females won't be far away. Usually the females will be behind you in deeper water channels, first break of bottom contour, large stumps, grass or nearby secondary points.

My favorite rig for catching these Big female Bass is a 'Mojo Rig' or CS Rig (pegged or bobber stop sinker 10-18" above plastic lure) on Seaguar InvizX Fluorocarbon line. Fan cast the target areas and drag the plastic slowly with rod, taking up slack



with your reel.

Lipless and square bill Crankbaits in red hues, along with spinnerbaits and jerkbaits will still produce some great Bass in March.

As for the Pre-Spawn staging Bass, main lake and secondary points can hold some Big Bass. We use large Swimbaits, squarebill Crankbaits, Carolina Rigs and Football Jigs on these structures with great success. We use 20 lb. Seaguar InvizX Fluorocarbon line for these techniques. Occasionally, 25

ne Moon Report" "March Pre-Spawn Crappie"

By Terri Moon

It's finally time for the spring migration on Fork! Water temperatures are gradually rising and when temps are between 55 and 60 degrees, start checking the main creeks and secondary points. The males will move in shallow first and the females will stage around the nearest deep water structure.

this time of year is when you finally find the crappie, a cold front will come through dropping water temps which in turn backs their movement off and the search begins again! When this happens, don't give up on the deep water crappie. There are still a bunch down the lake and they are less effected by the cold fronts.

The exciting part of slip bobber fishing is you never know what you're going to catch! We've already caught some really nice bass while searching shallow for crappie.

The baits working for us have been Lake Fork Tackle's live baby shad in sun perch, Cajun cricket or watermelon red pearl, chartreuse and pearl and Skipper jigs black and chartreuse.

As far as presentation in the early stages of pre-spawn, it is a very light bite – so a "slow



The toughest part of motion" or "no motion" approach seems to work best. Pay close attention to your line sometimes it will just go slack. So, if you see or feel anything different – just jerk! You'll find the shallower they go, the ALL and stay safe out harder they'll hit.

> Remember this time of year you'll find the crappie at many depths during their transition. The bridges are producing crappie 8-16 ft. while the staging crappie are found around the timber 5-10 ft., and spawners 1-5 ft. There are a lot of options if the weather or wind is a factor. The fun part of this time of year is that you never know WHAT you're going to catch at any depth because they are all on the move!

> Looks like the action is starting earlier than usual – hope you all don't miss out on the fun.

Please remember that the 10 inch minimum goes back in effect this month.



Texas Game Wardens Uncover Illegal White-Tailed Deer Smuggling Operation

investigation that led to the arrest and conviction of two individuals involved in illegally moving captive white-tailed deer. A South Texas deer breeder and his business partner were caught attempting to smuggle seven deer from a licensed deer breeding facility in East Texas through Montgomery County to Brazoria and Duval counties, where they intended to illegally release the deer into the wild on private property.

The case unfolded when a Montgomery County Game Warden conducted a traffic stop and discovered the illegally possessed deer being transported without required documentation or identification. Further investigation uncovered significant violations of Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) statutes and regulations, as well as criminal and traffic violations. Both individuals were arrested and booked into Montgomery County Jail. The deer breeder faced 41 total charges: one traffic code violation, 11 penal code viola-

Texas Game Wardens have concluded an tions and 29 deer breeder violations under movement of deer are regulated, among other the Texas Administrative Code and Parks and Wildlife Code. He pleaded guilty to three penal code violations and 29 deer breeder violations. His business partner was charged with two penal code violations and 28 deer breeder violations, of which he was convicted. Both men were convicted on multiple counts of violations committed with the intent to circumvent disease monitoring and testing requirements. Violations included failure to conduct ante-mortem chronic wasting disease (CWD) testing, failure to obtain valid transfer permits, removal of breeder deer without required identification and illegal possession of live game animals. Combined, they were convicted of a total of 57 deer breeder violations, one alcohol and two dangerous drug violations. They received a total \$12,060 in fines.

This case underscores the commitment of TPWD and Texas Game Wardens to protecting the state's natural resources and upholding wildlife regulations. The possession and

reasons, to mitigate the spread of diseases like CWD and to ensure the health of both captive and free-ranging wildlife populations. Anytime a white-tailed deer leaves a breeding facility, it must be uniquely and permanently identified, no matter its age. Breeder deer that have not been properly identified or have had their identification hidden or illegally changed or removed are commonly referred to as "ghost deer."

"Flagrant violations, such as intentionally transferring deer without identifiers, hinder Texas' ability to identify the source of a deer in the event of a disease detection," said Col. Ronald VanderRoest, TPWD Law Enforcement Director. "This creates the potential for negative impacts to the health of both captive and free ranging deer populations, the deer breeder industry, landowners, hunters and Texas' outdoor and rural based economies, where white-tailed deer hunting has a \$9.6 billion annual eco-(See White-Tailed Deer Smuggling.....

Disease experts indicate HPAI is circulating among wild birds in Texas as waterbirds and waterfowl visit their wintering grounds.

Detected in all states across the U.S., HPAI is a highly contagious zoonotic virus that transmits easily among wild and domestic birds. HPAI can also transmit to mammals including wild mammals and domestic cats. It can spread directly between animals and indirectly through environmental contamination.

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) advises wildlife rehabilitators to exercise caution when admitting wild animals showing clinical signs of HPAI and to refrain from admitting any birds exhibiting such symptoms.


The public can assist in interrupting HPAI transmission by limiting all unnecessary contact with wild birds, including the discontinuation of feeding and other activities that cause waterfowl to congregate in parks. In addition, taking down all bird feeders and bird baths is recommended, as these allow birds to congre-

leave bird feeders and bird baths out are asked to clean them several times each week with a ten percent bleach solution and watch for signs of disease. Do not handle any sick or dead wildlife or allow any pets to consume any wild carcasses.

Currently, the transmission risk of avian influenza from infected birds to people remains low, but the public should take basic protective measures if contact with wild animals cannot be avoided. The public and health care professionals can find more information about HPAI in humans from the Texas Department of State Health Services. If an individual had contact with an HPAI-positive or suspect animal and develops signs of illness, immediately contact your health care provider and let them know about the exposure.

If you encounter a wild animal with signs consistent with HPAI, contact local TPWD wildlife biologist. your





Deer Contest. The individual who shot the deer gator. The alligator skull is expected to meet or was from out of state and did not possess a license. She then bought a license five hours later after entering the deer into the contest. The deer scored 172 5/8 Boone and Crockett Score. Cases and Civil restitution pending.

-- Decoyed-- While checking duck hunters along the Frio River, a game warden contacted a boat containing four duck hunters. The "so-called" guide stated he did not have a hunting license, identification and failed to have enough PFD's for his hunters on board. While inspecting the ducks, one hunter attempted to awkwardly pick up a pile of decoys and move it away from the warden. When the warden asked the hunter what was under the pile of decoys and why he tried to move them in such a weird manner, the hunter stated he found a large alligator skull on the bank. He attempted to hide it as he was unsure if it was legal for him to possess. The hunter was informed he could not possess the skull which was found on the Daughtry Wildlife Management Area (WMA). Multiple cases were filed for hunting without a license, insufficient PFD's and illegal possession of an alliexceed the record for the largest alligator documented on the Choke Canyon.

--Citizen Assist-- A Lubbock District game warden received a call regarding hunters being on the Dimmit Playa WMA in Castro County. The Dimmit Playa WMA is a drawn only hunt property and the informant that called was a hunter who had won the drawn hunt and was currently scouting the property for the upcoming weekend. The informant told the warden that when he arrived at the Dimmit Playa there was a pickup parked at the gate of the property. As he got closer, he noticed three hunters firing shotguns inside the property. The Castro County Sheriff's Office was dispatched and arrived on scene first due to logistics. After interviewing the suspects, the sheriff discovered they had killed five pheasants. The warden coordinated with the sheriff and all five pheasants were seized and civil restitution was filed. The suspects were also cited for the following violations: Taking or Possessing species from a

Wildlife Management Area, Failure to have an Annual Public Hunting Permit and a No Upland Game Bird Endorsement Violation.

-- The Munchies-- Wardens were patrolling in Childress County for state law violations when they observed a vehicle with a Louisiana license plate traveling East on a rural highway. A traffic stop was conducted and during the initial contact with the driver, the warden's pointed out that there was a small purple box with a marijuana leaf insignia on it that appeared to have "THC" written on the box. Warden's had the driver exit his vehicle and questioned him about his trip across the U.S. During the investigation, the driver admitted to having some marijuana and THC edibles inside the vehicle. A probable cause search of the vehicle yielded several containers of THC wax, THC edible candy, marijuana and several drug paraphernalia items. The driver was booked into the Childress County Jail without incident and charged with possession of a controlled substance PG2



-- Unintended Consequences -- A Williamson County game warden received an Operation Game Thief call regarding a buck shot out of season. The warden contacted the hunter who admitted to shooting a small four-point whitetail deer on Jan. 9. He said it was unintentional and thought it was a spike. The hunter was asked for his hunting license and he went inside his house to retrieve it. When the hunter gave it to the warden, he noticed the harvest log was not filled out and upon inspection one buck tag was missing. The warden asked to see the tag since the hunter stated he processed deer at home. The hunter took out the tag from his shirt pocket and gave it to the warden. The tag was not filled out and the dates were not cut out. Citations were issued.

--Outdoor Essentials-- A Bastrop County game warden attended a youth program hosted by a local church. The program is called, The Outdoor Zone, and the motto is "No Child Left Inside". This program encourages kids to spend more time outdoors and they meet monthly to

learn about outdoor activities including hunting, fishing and camping. They focus on boys from single parent homes, but any child is welcome to participate. This month's program consisted of four activities; how to use a compass, how to cook with a Dutch oven, building a fire, what a game warden is, and why they do what they do. They really enjoyed all the activities, however, learning about game wardens was voted their favorite activity. Some even mentioned that they would like to become a game warden. The Operation Game Thief trailer was a big hit and may have played a role in their voting.

--Flushing Out a Poacher--On Nov. 2, Henderson County Game Wardens filed charges against a man for hunting without landowner consent. The wardens had been investigating the suspect since last deer season, when they found an unusual hunting blind made out of a converted port-a-potty. Unable to catch the suspect last year, wardens set up a game camera along the property line in hopes the hunter would return to hunt the same unusual blind.

On the opening morning of deer season, the

camera captured the suspect walking to his "toilet stand." Not long after, wardens confronted the hunter and he confessed to hunting without permission. Charges were filed, and the man removed the blind and feeder from the property.

-- Bailout Results in Bale-Out-- While assisting other law enforcement agencies as part of Operation Lone Star, a Texas Game Warden and his K9 partner, Jake, were called to track a bailout suspect. Before starting their search for the bailout, though, Jake alerted to the vehicle — an indication people could be inside. However, Jake and his partner began pursuing the track of the bailout suspect and left the vehicle alone so it could be processed for evidence. After successfully locating and aiding in the apprehension of their suspect, the game warden received a call from the agent at the scene and were surprised to learn the haybale in the bed of the truck had just flipped over and requested assistance. Officers discovered 10 undocumented individuals hiding inside the fake hay bale.





- 4. Check in times: Fri., Mar. 7, 4 p.m. to 9 p.m. and Sat., Mar. 8, 5 a.m. to 6 a.m. at Oak Ridge Marina.
- 5. To qualify, contestants must check in at tournament headquarters before fishing.
- 6. Fishing hours will be 6:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. (official clock at sign-in station). NO FISH-ING from midnight till start time.
- 7. Fishing will be done on Lake Fork only (trailering allowed).
- ${\bf 8.\ Contestants\ must\ fish\ from\ a\ boat.\ NO-bank\ fishing\ or\ leaving\ the\ boat\ to\ land\ a\ fish.}$
- 9. Life jackets must be worn any time their outboard motor is running.
- 10. All state, federal, and local laws must be obeyed or contestant and fish may be disqualified. No slot fish may be brought to weigh-in.
- 11. No one may have more than five (5) fish in their possession at any time. Only one (1) may be 24" or greater.
- 12. Largemouth bass 12" to 16" or 24" or greater in length may be weighed. No fish under 12" or between 16" and 24" will be weighed (or state law limits at the time of the tourna-
- ment).

 13. All fish must be caught on artificial bait by casting. (No trolling with gas engine). Pork
- trailer may be used.

 14. Weigh-in starts at 3:00 p.m. (official clock at sign-in). You must be in the weigh-in line by 3:30 p.m.
- 15. All fish must be brought to the scales in weigh-in bags.
- 16. No iced or frozen fish will be weighed. Ice may be added ONLY to aid in survival of fish.
- 17. Each contestant will be responsible for weighing his or her own fish. (No pooling of fish).
- 18. Dead fish at weigh-in will be penalized 1/2 (.5) pound. All fish weighed in become the property of TTB and will be released (with the exception of trophy

- 19. In the event of a tie for any position, prize money for that position and the following positions will be combined and evenly devided between the tying contestants.
- 20. Contestants may not have served as a compensated guide on Lake Fork 30 days prior to the tournmanet.
- 21. Contestants may fish with a guide on Lake Fork prior to the day before fishing this TTB tournament.
- 22. Use of alcoholic beverages or controlled drugs are prohibited during tournament hours. Prescription drug use should be declared at sign-in.
- 23. Anyone who has ever been disqualified for cheating or misconduct from any tournament is ineligible to fish.
- 24. Any contestant who violates any rule may be disqualified. Any act of a competitor, verbal or physical, that reflects unfavorably upon TTB's effort to promote fishing, conservation, clean waters, courtesy or safety shall be reason for disqualification from this and all future TTB tournaments.
- 25. Parent or guardian must accompany contestants under 18 years of age.
- 26. All protests must be registered in writing with the tournament judges within 15 minutes after designated weigh-in time. All decisions of the tournament judges will be final in all matters. Anyone protesting the outcome of an open tournament will have to pay for any additional polygraph test given.
- 27. All boats are welcome to participate. An aerated livewell is recommended to aid in fish survival for live release. Anglers cannot leave boat to land a fish.
- 28. All contestants are responsible to have read these rules and must agree to abide by them (by signing the entry form) while competing in this TTB event.
- 29. Contestants will be subject to polygraph test. Failure to take and/or pass such a test will result in disqualification.


