

pretty much daily in search of big bass? Call it For the past 26 years they have done an excelfate. Call it nature smiling on this water. Call it great management by Texas Parks and Wildlife. But whatever you do, call on Lake Fork early and often. The powerhouse fishery east of Dallas produced 36 Toyota ShareLunker bass (fish weighing 8 pounds or more) between Jan. 1 and April 30. That's more than any other fishery in Texas, which is saying a lot in a state known for liking everything large. The biggest of the catches was a 12.56-pound, 26-inch long toad boated by Sterling Pfeifer of Commerce City, Colo., on March 27. At the Tackle Warehouse Bassmaster Elite at Lake Fork held May 8–11, each angler in the final-day cut caught more than 100 pounds over four days - the second year in a row the Progressive Bassmaster Elite Series has seen the entire Top 10 earn Century Club status."

Also, I'll give credit where credit is due. The Lake Fork Sportsman's Association continually cares for the prosperity on this great reservoir. lent job in securing the longevity of Lake Fork. From the Live Release Boat making sure all bass in the tournaments are released back in the lake at all tournaments, to grass rejuvenation, placing manmade structure, to placing fish attractors and habitat and much more. This organization is made up of members that volunteer their time and energy to the preservation of our great reservoir. If you are not a member and love fishing Lake Fork, have a home here, a business, or a guide on the lake, go look in the mirror and ask yourself why you are not a member. They have their monthly meeting at Jamie's Restaurant the second Tuesday of each month beginning at 6:30. I'd like to see you care and be there.

As mentioned previously, Lake Fork is definitely on the rebound from previous years. Reports show an increase in the catches and sizes. With 36 Toyota ShareLunker bass weighing 8-pounds or more between January 1 and

April 30, 2025. These numbers increase daily.

August

In the Mega Bass Tournament put on by Bass-Champs there were 8 over the slot bass brought to the weigh-in with a 9.88-pound being the heaviest. In the 20th Annual Legend of Lake Fork there were 9 over the slot bass brought to the scales. Four of these were in the 10-pound weight ranging from 10.27-pound to 10.98-pound and an 11.27-pound was the heaviest to win the tournament. In the Skeeter Owners Tournament there were 17 over the 24" slot brought to the scales with the heaviest weighing 10.04-pounds.

These are all documented facts of proof, Lake Fork may have been in a sleeper mode or I'd like to think of it as recuperation mode. This great reservoir has never been dead as the catches prove. One fact is definitely obvious to anglers fishing these waters, she is now awake and thriving. Lake Fork is "The Big Bass Capital of Texas" and always will be. If you want to catch large bass, this is the water for you. Hope to see you on the lake.

On June 5th, 10 completed fish attractors were loaded up and sunk in Lake Fork. Lake Fork Sportsman's Association, an all-volunteer non-profit organization, had secured a grant from Friends of Reservoirs that LFSA matched in money and labor. The design was originally developed by the Georgia Department of Natural Resources. Each fish attractor is approximately $3\frac{1}{2}$ ' x 7' with a PVC pipe frame and plastic corrugated drainpipe looped through it. LFSA secured the materi-

als and the spring Ag class at Yantis High School, under teacher Mike Moore, constructed the 10 fish attractors as a class project. Project chairman Marty Jarrell oversaw the project and was the liaison with Yantis H.S. Five fish attractors were sunk in two different locations to provide cover for fish. More importantly, they serve as a hiding place for young fingerling bass to allow them to hide and grow. Texas Parks and Wildlife Department stocks hundreds of thousands of fingerling bass every year to replenish Lake Fork. Members of Lake Fork

Sportsman's Association and a team from Texas Parks and Wildlife Department loaded the fish attractors on LFSA's live-release boat and TPWD's boat and weighed down by 4 cinder blocks on each, sunk them on either side of the County Road 2946 bridge.

There are other structures that have been added at Lake Fork, many attributed to previous projects by Lake Fork Sportsman's Association. The GPS locations can be found on Texas Parks and Wildlife's website under Texas Fish Habitat Structures.

will appear on your electronics as interference or fuzzy return. The depth of it will vary in different areas of the lake. Bass will always be above the level of the thermocline, often time suspended just above it, over deeper water, or they seek out high spots (points, pond dams, ridges, roadbeds/ underwater bridges) that are above it. The suspended bass will typically relate to a drop off of some sort.

As for lures to target the suspended bass, drop shot rigs, spoons and jig head minnows are some examples to consider. For worm rigs for bottom oriented bass, I find that straight tail worms typically work better than curly tail this time of year.

However, August usually is the beginning of some offshore bass beginning to migrate shallower. So, just because it's the Dog Days of Summer, don't think they're aren't some big bass on shallower cover.



ide, News You Can Use" August "The Moon Report" "Fork's Summertime Crappie and Bream"

By Terri Moon

It finally set in – those 100 degree days! The afternoons are way too hot for me – but, the mornings are very doable! In fact, surprisingly pleasant!

The bite has been best around mid-morning. They are gradually moving deeper and this week they are biting 16-20 ft. in 20-30 ft. of water. I'm starting to see a thermocline set in at about 20 ft. It's been a very light bite.

You need to really watch your line or you're going to miss a lot of bites! It can be as subtle as a line twitch or if it goes slack, you need to instantly react. Stay in contact with your bait because loose line will lose fish! The crappie haven't been on a feeding frenzy so you really have to optimize every opportunity. The biggest mistake I see people make is once they set the hook, they will drop their rod tip leaving slack line and by the time they catch up to their bait, the fish is gone. So, keep that rod tip up and the line tight! A slow motion no motion – presentation is working best for us right now so try real hard not to overwork your bait.

The colors working for us are Monkey Milk, Blue Ice – also, Threadfin Shad or Caddo Morning. It just depends on the water clarity in



the area we're fishing and the brightness of the time of day.

The crappie have been in and out of the bridges and showing up on main lake points, humps and creek channel bends. Look for areas with drop-offs with access to shallower water. Look for balls of baitfish with your graph. This will give you an indication on how deep to fish.

Now as far as the bream fishing, it's been fun! I have to admit I've been sneaking out there on my days off just to catch 'me'' some! These are hands down MY favorite fish to catch and eat! It's really been a 'hoot' watching the kids this month reel in these hard fighting bream! It's so cute to watch them make memories they'll remember for a lifetime!

We're finding them in 1-5 ft. around grasslines and willows. Then after the new and full moon times, they will back off in 5-15

ft. in that same general area. Nightcrawlers or crickets on a slip bobber or tightlined will work. I also keep a jar of Berkley's Gulp 1" minnows in the boat in case I run across some nice bream in a brush pile!

Wish you all the best out there. Stay hydrated, plenty of sun block and a bigger hat and enjoy the summer:

alligator and dove, plus guided packages for exotic species and bighorn sheep are a few types of hunts available through the Texas public drawn hunt system. Last year, more than 300,000 applications were submitted to TPWD. Application deadlines are the 1st and 15th of each month between Aug. 1 and Nov. 1. For example, applications for all alligator hunt categories and private land dove hunts are due Aug. 1, while deadlines for archery deer, archery mule deer, pronghorn, private land pronghorn and javelina are Aug. 15. Application fees range from free to \$3 to \$10, depending on the hunt category. If selected, adult hunters may need to pay a special permit fee of \$80 for regular hunts or \$130 for extended hunts. Categories such as youth-only hunts and specified others do not require application or permit fees. Permits are open to residents and non-resident hunters alike.

To apply for e-Postcard hunts and U.S. Forest Service antlerless deer permits, applicants must have a current Annual Public Hunt Permit (APH). APH permits go on sale annually on Aug. 15. Last year, 59,605 APH permits were sold, generating approximately \$2.8 million in revenue for wildlife conservation and public hunting opportunities.

The Drawn Hunts Catalog interactive map shows all drawn hunt opportunities by category or by area. All applications, fee payments and permit issuance are handled electronically. All applicants will need internet access, an email address and a credit or debit card to participate. The most effective way to access the system is through the customer ID number from the applicant's hunting or fishing license. Visit the drawn hunt website for a full list of category deadlines. Hunters can apply until 11:59 p.m. CST on the application deadline. Applicants can check their drawing status online at any time.



and a spike in arrests for boating while intoxicated (BWI), Texas Game Wardens remind boaters to follow the rules and safety precautions that can help them avoid preventable accidents as they head to the water to beat the summer heat. As of June 30, Texas has experienced 59 water-related fatalities this year, including 38 open-water drownings and 21 boating-related deaths. That's a 75 percent increase in boating-related fatalities from this time last year. From Memorial Day weekend through the end of June, 12 people died in open-water drownings, six succumbed to boating-related incidents and 13 people were arrested for BWI. Game wardens issued 213 citations for life

Of the 83 BWI arrests by Texas Game Wardens this year, 62 of those occurred in May alone with the majority issued during Memorial Day Weekend. "If you're drinking and operating a boat, you're not only breaking the law-you're putting lives at risk," said Cody Jones, assistant







Texas Game Wardens, Grapevine Police Department Make Arrests for Fatal Hit and Run Over Memorial Day Weekend

Texas Game Wardens, Grapevine Police Department and Homeland Security Investigations arrested two individuals believed to be involved



in the fatal hit and run boat collision on the evening of May 25 at Grapevine Lake. A personal watercraft (PWC), which had two females on board, was being driven at a high speed near the shoreline of Oak Grove Park when it collided with a kayak occupied by 18-year-old Ava Moore. The driver of the PWC, 21-year-old Daikerlyn Alejandra Gonzalez: Gonzalez from Venezuela, and the passenger fled the scene.



Later, Gonzalez and the passenger returned to Oak Grove Park. The passenger remained on scene with witnesses and was interviewed by Grapevine Police Department, while Gonzalez left in a vehicle with 21-year-old Maikel Coello Perozo. While fleeing the area, the pair collided with two other vehicles. Grapevine Police Department is leading the case into the automotive hit and run while Texas Game Wardens investigate the boating accident. Gonzalez and Perozo were arrested in Dallas on May 27. Gonzalez has been charged with Manslaughter, which is a second-degree felony. Perozo has been

"These arrests will not undo the heartbreak of losing Ava Moore, in this incident inbut we will continue to provide support to her family throughout the criminal justice process," said Amanda McNew, Media Manager for the Grapevine Police Department. Enforcement Removal Operations Dallas lodged immigration detainers with the Grapevine Police Department following the arrest of Gonzalez and Perozo. Both are in removal proceedings pursuant to the policies of the Immigration and Nationality Act, as aliens present without admission or parole. "Our partnerships with law enforcement across jurisdictions are key during these types of investigations," said Travis Pickard, Special Agent in Charge ICE Homeland Security Investigations Dallas.

The following items are compiled from recent Texas Parks and Wildlife Department law enforcement reports.

-Mistaken Identity-- A DeWitt County Game Warden received a complaint about a hunter suspected of taking a deer out of season. When the suspect was contacted, her husband's tag was on the deer. The husband initially claimed to have shot the deer. After interviewing both individuals, it was determined that the initial subject had in fact shot the deer. It was not taken out of season, but it was taken without a license. When all was said

and done, violations included hunting without a license, hunting under the license of another, allowing another to hunt under one's license, no proof of sex, and no hunters education. The deer was seized and donated. Restitution is pending.

-Who Ya Gonna Call-A Jasper County game warden received a call about a deer killed out of season. Upon arriving at the residence, the warden and their partner noticed a bloody cooler with loppers lying next to it. The owner of the residence told the wardens that he picked up the deer from the side of the road. When asked if he notified anyone, the man said, "Yes. I called 911, but no one answered." It was later determined the individual shot the deer on his property. Citations were issued.



in a bucket and one was a really big fish. The warden inspected the fish and pulled out a largemouth bass measuring 14 inches and asked the child if he caught the big fish. The child replied, "No, my brother caught it with the cast net." When confronted, the adult admitted to catching one largemouth bass and a crappie. Citations and civil restitution were filed.

-Whoops-A Bexar County game warden was patrolling the southside of San Antonio when they saw vehicle tire tracks entering a water treatment facility. The warden entered the property to search for trespassers when he saw a man on a kayak along the banks of the private lake. The suspect caught a five-pound bass, weighed it, took a picture with his cell phone and then put the bass in to his kayak. When the man saw the game warden truck, he said "Hi." The man told the warden he drove his vehicle around the gate and fence to enter the property. Water treatment security arrived at the scene to sign a non-consent form. The suspect was arrested and booked. The case is pending. -Adopt Don't Shop-A Mitchell/Howard County game warden received a call about a Howard County resident who admitted to being in possession of a juvenile American Alligator without a proper permit. The warden met with the resident and was able to take custody of the juvenile alligator. When interviewing the resident, the warden discovered that the resident was given the alligator by another individual who could not take care of it. Later that week, the warden met with the original owner who admitted having possession of the alligator. The juvenile alligator was relocated to a rehabilitation center and charges are pending.

-Game Wardens' Best Friend- An Orange County game warden responded to a call from a petroleum company to report someone hunting without landowner consent. Upon arrival on the property, the warden identified and made contact with an individual that was within the property and admitted to hunting hogs with dogs. Another subject was hiding in the woods, but the warden was able to get his name and phone number from one of the dogs' collars. After more than an hour and a half, the subject came out of the woods. The warden identified and released both subjects to obtain non-consent affidavits from the landowner's agent. Cases pending on both subjects.

-Oh, Crap(pie)- Three Williamson County game wardens were checking night fishermen at Lake Granger and the San Gabriel River when they saw a man and woman loading up their fishing gear and getting ready to leave. The warden identified himself and asked if they had any luck, and the woman replied and said they had caught two fish. Both individuals showed the wardens their valid fishing licenses and let the warden see the two fish they had on the stringer. The warden saw a Styrofoam ice chest and asked them if they had any fish in there. The man said, "Yes, we do but one might be small." The warden opened the ice chest and found two undersized crappies measuring nine inches. Citations and civil restitution were filed.

-Caught Red Handed- A Matagorda County game warden received a call about a group of individuals keeping undersized redfish on Sargent Beach. The warden and their partner drove to the location and spotted the vehicle. While waiting for the initial vehicle to exit the beach, another call came in about another vehicle suspected of keeping too many redfish. The wardens had both vehicles in their sight, so when contact was made with the first vehicle, the second vehicle turned around and started heading away from the wardens. -Fishin' for Trouble- An Orange County game warden and a Newton County game warden teamed up to conduct a Natural Resource Damage Assessment (NRDA) patrol out of Sabine Pass into the Gulf of Mexico. On their way back to the port, they spotted a boat doing some commercial fishing and conducted a

did not display commercial fishing plates. The captain also did not have written authorization to use the license and a helper on the boat was not licensed as a general commercial fisherman. Cases pending on both commercial fishermen.

-Honesty Goes a Long Way- A Newton County game warden was patrolling southern Newton County when he saw an ATV being illegally operated on a public roadway while the occupants were holding rifles. When the warden contacted the suspects and noticed they had a spotlight with them. The warden asked them what they were doing, and the group said they were riding around looking for animals to shoot from the roadway, but they hadn't killed anything yet. Cases are pending.

-He's a Rescue- Texas Game Wardens and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Agents inspected some antique resale stores. These locations had alligator skulls, black bear mounts, waterfowl mounts, raptor mounts and migratory bird mounts for sale. During the inspection of one

patrol stop. During their inspection, they found the boat store, an individual entered with a pet possum. In order to possess, sell, or purchase a fur-bearer, a person must have a valid Fur-bearing Propagation Permit. The possum was confiscated and relocated to a licensed rehabber. Citations were issued and cases are pending.

The wardens contacted the current registered owner who said the boat had been stolen from Belton in 2009. A police report was never made. The vessel was seized and citations were issued to the subject who sold the vessel.
