aware of the reason it is called fishing and not catching is that the bite isn't always what they want or expect. There were a lot of 2-pound plus bass brought in and 31 bass over the 24" slot. With the slot on Lake Fork being between 16" to 24" no bass between those measurements could be brought in. Only three anglers did learn the hard way to measure their bass properly. Many of the anglers reported catching bass just short of the 24" line that they could not bring to the weighin. This shows Lake Fork is back and doing great.

On Friday, the first day of the tournament there were eight bass over the slot brought to the scales. It all began in the 7 to 8 o'clock hour. Austin Bray from Drexel, MO. earning him \$2,500 when he weighed in a 8.49-pound bass for 1st Place for that hour. Coming in 2nd place for that hour was Robert Brooks from Ardmore, OK. with a bass weighing 7.09-pounds. In the 8 to 9 o'clock hour being the double bonus T-shirt hour, Tommy Washington from Milam, TX. earned \$5,000 for 1st Place in the hour when he weighed in a 9.58-pound bass. In the 9 to 10 o'clock hour one bass over the slot

came to the scales weighing 6.82-pounds caught by Christopher Sweaks from Allen, TX. In the 10 to 11 o'clock hour there were two overs weighed in. Monty Sewell from Tayor, AR. weighed in a bass weighing 9.72-lbs. winning him \$2500 and in 2nd weighing in an 8.55-lb. bass was Eli Vaughan from Palestine, TX. In the 11 to 12 o'clock hour there was one over brought to the scale. Michael McKinney from Ninnekah, OK. weighed in a 6.54-pound bass winning him \$2,.500 in the hour. In the 12 to 1 o'clock hour there were no overs brought in so Billy Pritchett from Big Sandy, TX. placed first in the bonus hour winning \$5,000 with a 2.39-lb. bass. In the 1 to 2 o'clock hour there was only one over brought to the scales. It was caught by Blake Frasure from Grethel, KY. weighing 8.51-lbs.

On Saturday, the second day of the tournament ten bass over the slot were brought to the scales. In the 7 to 8 o'clock hour Carl Carpenter from Hot Springs, AR. weighed in a 7.74-lb. and Ray Mcgee from Seabrook, TX. weighed a 6.53-lb. bass. In the 8 to 9 o'clock hour Nathan Burrow from Conway, AR. weighed in an 8.46lb. bass winning himself \$5,000 in the bonus hour. In the 9 to 10 o'clock hour Tator Reynolds from Florien, LA. weighed an 9.40-lb. bass and Buddy Rawlinson from Rusk, TX. weighed an 8.60-lb. bass. In the 10 to 11 o'clock hour Jason Borofka from Lavon, TX. weighed an 8.19-lb. bass and Zachary Haney from Terrell, TX. weighed a 7.99-lb. bass. In the 11 to 12 o'clock hour Bradley Virgillito from Bossier City, LA. weighed a 5.61-pound bass. In the 12 to 1 o'clock hour Jacob Callahan from Yantis, TX. weighed in an 8.84 winning him \$5.000 in the bonus hour. In the 1 to 2 o'clock hour Travis Simmons from Ragley, LA. weighed in a 7.79-lb. bass. On Sunday, the last day of the tournament, there were thirteen bass over the slot brought to the scales. In the 7 -8 o'clock hour Austin McAdoo from Benton, AR. weighed in a 10.83-lb. bass. In the 8 to 9 o'clock hour Wesley Holt from Sieper, LA. weighed in an 8.75-pound bass and Essix Hawkins from Pine Bluff, AR. weighed in an 8.57-lb. bass. In the 9 to 10 o'clock hour there was no over brought to the scales and David Laymance

During the 11 to 12 o'clock hour Colten Pusateri from McKinney, TX. weighed a 9.23-pound bass and Michael Crow from Broomfield, CO. weighed in a 6.02lb. bass. In the 12 to 1 o'clock hour Christopher Bush from Huntington, TX. weighed in a 9.08-lb. bass and Carl Carpenter from Hot Springs, AR. weighed in an 8.66-lb. bass. During the 1 to 2 o'clock hour Gilbert Miller from Midlothian, TX. weighed in an 8.37-lb. bass. Dana Vinson from Henderson, TX. weighed an 8.18-lb. bass; Colton Pusateri from McKinney, TX, weighed a 7.75-lb. bass; Taylor Murphy from Camden, AR. weighed a 7.17-lb. bass; and Marcus Arrington from Monticello, AR. weighed a 6.25-lb. bass.

Heaviest bass under the slot winning that angler an extra \$5,000 was James Russ from Lubbock, Texas on Friday with a 2.60-pound bass. On Saturday Charlie King from Coushatta, LA. with a bass weighing 2.75-lbs won \$5,000 and on Sunday Michael Yarbrough from Longview, Texas weighed a 2.49-pound bass winning him \$5,000.

Winning an additional \$2,500 in the exact weights drawings of 2.50-pounds was Kenneth McLemore from Antioch, IL, and Joel Molina from Apoka, FL. for Friday; William Matthews from Quitman, LA. and Jerry Wheeler from Batesville, AR. for Saturday; and Courtney Irving from McKinney, TX. and Jeff Westfall from Nashville, AR. for Sunday.

In the elimination drawing Rickie Washington from Shelbyville, Texas won a Phoenix 819 PRO powered by Mercury, and equipped with Minn Kota and Humminbird.

Winning 3rd place overall was Tommy Washington from Milam, TX. with a weight of 9.58-pounds. For his efforts he won an extra \$10,000. Winning 4th place overall with a weight of 9.40-lbs. was Tator Reynolds from Florien, LA. He took home

an extra \$5,000. Coming in 5th place overall was Colton Pusateri from McKinney, TX. with a weight of 9.23-pounds. For his catch he took home an extra \$2,500. During the course of the tournament there were 31 bass weighed in over the slot. On Friday there was a total of 337 bass weighed for a total weight of 687.51-pounds. On Saturday there were 305 bass weighed for a total weight of 634.45-pounds. On Sunday there were 240 bass weighed for a total weight of 538.21-pounds. Total bass weighed in the tournament was 882 for a total weight of 1,860.17-pounds. The Lake Fork Sportsman's Association did an excellent job with their Live Release Boat returning all the bass back into the lake in healthy condition to be caught another day.

It was disappointing that only one double-digit bass Lake Fork made the show, but the overall number of over the slots that did show and the great weights shows this lake is not one to be overlooked.




"The Transition in Bass Movement Is Here!"

Square Bill crank baits and spinnerbaits are great to work the outer grass lines, shallow wood and docks this time of year. Square Bills and smaller lipless crank baits are great producers in shallow flats that can be alive with Shad activity and feeding Bass.

"The Moon Report" Lake Fork's October Fun!

October is one of the most enjoyable times of the year to chase crappie on Lake Fork. As the first real cool fronts begin to roll through East Texas, the air turns crisp, the lake grows a little quieter after the busy summer months, and the crappie begin to feed more actively in preparation for winter. For anglers who love both the catch and the fall scenery, October delivers some of the best action you'll see all year.

By October, Lake Fork water temperatures typically fall into the upper 60's to low 70's, and that change triggers crappie to move shallower than they were in the hot summer. While many fish still hold on mid-depth brush piles, standing timber, and bridge columns, you'll also start finding more activity around creek channels, submerged timberlines, and staging areas near spawning flats. This mix of patterns makes October fishing both exciting and versatile – you can catch crappie in a variety of spots and depths.

Brush piles and tim-



ber 12-20 ft. of water remains productive, especially on manmade brush piles and submerged hardwoods. Lake Fork bridges are famous for holding crappie especially in October – they're often stacked around pilings 15-25 ft. As the shad migrate into the creeks during the fall, schools of crappie follow. Focus on bends, ledges, and drop-offs where bait is present.

Electronics play a huge roll in locating schools this time of year. Livescope and modern sonar make it easier than ever to spot suspended crappie and target individual fish. In October, crappie feed heavily on shad – so shad colored jigs and minnows are top producers. Soft plastics in white, pearl, monkey milk, and char-

treuse jig bodies paired with 1/16-1/8 oz. jig heads will produce. Also, Skipper hair jigs 1/16-1/8 oz. in black/chartreuse, chartreuse/blue, and orange/blue tail, or white/chartreuse are productive.

If you find the crappie finicky after a cold front – by all means – tip that jig with a minnow or a Berkley power nibble.

Vertical jigging is effective on timber and bridge columns. Then casting and swimming jigs is great for creek channels and brush piles where fish are suspended. Slowing down your presentation pays off in October, especially right after a front when crappie may be less aggressive.

October crappie fishing on Lake Fork is

Labor Day Weekend Boating Incidents, Rise

Texas Game Wardens patrolling water bodies across the state over the 2025 Labor Day holiday weekend reported fewer boating incidents compared to last year, but a rise in boating-related fatalities. From Aug. 29–Sept. 1, game wardens responded to seven boating incidents, two boatingrelated fatalities and no open-water drownings. They also arrested seven individuals for boating while intoxicated. In 2024, wardens reported nine boating incidents, one boating-related fatality and one openwater drowning over the same holiday period.

The two fatalities this year occurred on Lake Buchanan and Lake Conroe. In 2024, the single fatality occurred at Amistad Reservoir. "We are saddened by

the lives lost over the holiday weekend," said Col. Ron VanderRoest,

This is an individual tournament. More than one angler can fish in a boat, but all must be a paid entry and have a means of keeping their catches separated.

Entry fee for the tournament is \$45 with 80% of all entry fees paid back and Big Bass Pot \$10 with 100% pay back. Based on 100 entries 1st Place pays \$1,040; 2nd Place \$780; 3rd Place \$520; 4th Place \$260; 5th thru 10th \$100. Big-Bass Pot pays 3 places with 1st Big Bass paying \$500, 2nd paying \$300., and 3rd paying \$200. Fishing hours for the tournament are from 6 am to 3:30 pm. All anglers must be checked in by 3:30 pm. Lake slot rules apply. A bass can touch the 16inch mark but not exceed and be at least 12 inches in length. An over the slot must at least touch the 24 inches in length to be legal. Any bass between 16 and 24 inches brought to the weigh-in is illegal and the angler will be disqualified. The official measuring stick for the tournament is the Chek-It-Stick.

Anglers can enter the tournament by picking up an entry at one of the area businesses and mailing it in at the address listed on the entry. For those of you who wish to enter at tournament headquarters on October 10th, from 4 pm to more information see the ad on page 22.

Game Warden Field Notes

The following items are compiled from recent Texas Parks and Wildlife Department law enforcement reports.

-Swift Water Rescue-A Terrell County game warden responded to a call from the sheriff's office when a local rancher was caught in a flash flood. His truck had died and was starting to move downstream from the rising water reaching the hood of his truck. It was dark and there were no lights to light his way to safety, so he called 911 for help. The warden responded along with a deputy and volunteers. Armed with swift water personal floatation devices (PFD), a throw bag, and rope they were able to make their way to the truck and extract the rancher to safety while being mindful of fencing downstream that could trap anyone who may lose their footing in the rushing water. Everyone went home safely that night.

-Cue the Mutombo Finger Wag- Two Jefferson County game wardens were patrolling Taylor's Bayou when they saw a man in a shallowdrive mud boat quickly approaching them in the narrow bayou. The wardens motioned for

the subject to slow down and he shook his finger at them. The wardens were able to position their patrol boat beside the subject and get his full attention, forcing him to come to a stop. The subject claimed he didn't understand they asked him to stop. After checking his safety equipment, the wardens initiated an investigation after noticing signs of intoxication. The warden placed the subject under arrest for Boating While Intoxicated (BWI) and booked him into the Jefferson County Jail. The subject consented to a voluntary blood draw.

1. Preheat oven to 375. In a medium bowl, combine flour, apple-pie spice, baking soda and salt. In a large bowl, using a mixer set on

high, beat butter, brown sugar and granulated sugar until fluffy. With the mixer on low, beat eggs and vanilla; beat in flour mixture.

2. Remove 1/3 cup of dough to a small mix-ing bowl; tint green. Tint remaining dough red; divide in half.

3. On a lightly floured 24 green wooden craft surface, roll half of the red dough to a 1/4-inch thickness. Using an appleshapped template or cookie cutter, cut dough into shapes; place 3 inches apart on an ungreased bak-ing

> 4. Place a craft stick under "stem" end of each cookie. pressing dough lightly.

5. Using your fingers, mold a small piece of green dough into a leaf shape and place on top of each apple cutout on baking sheet.

6. Repeat rolling and cutting process with remaining dough. Bake until crisp, but not browned, 8 to 10 minutes. Transfer cookies to wire racks; cool completely. 7. In a small saucepan, heat caramels and water over low heat, stirring often, until smooth. Set a wire rack over a waxed paper-lined baking sheet. Dip the cookies into melted caramel and then into chopped nuts. Let cookies stand until caramel is set, about an hour.



Game Warden Field Notes (Continued from Page 22)

Case is pending.

–Early Bird Gets the TicketGalveston County Game Wardens were patrolling Galveston Bay and East Bay and saw several shrimp boats maneuvering in a manner consistent with shrimping. One vessel had nets and doors in the water. When asked to retrieve the net, it revealed cod. Several vessels were cited for shrimping before legal hours. Cases are pending.

—Four-Wheeler of Misfortune— While patrolling Twin Buttes Public Lands in Tom Green County, a local game warden made contact with several individuals riding all-terrain vehicles. Some of the individuals were unable to produce a limited public use permit, as required to access the public lands. The warden decided to check if some of the ATVs were stolen and discovered one individual was in possession of a stolen four-wheeler from a nearby city. The case was turned over to the originating jurisdiction for investigation.

–Don't I Know You? – A Montgomery County game warden received a call from a local deer camp lessee

who said he was texted photos of a truck entering the property without consent. While responding to the location, the warden provided sheriff's deputies with the location of the lease and the layout of the property. The deputies walked into the property, due to heavy rains and the lack of 4X4 vehicles. They apprehended a suspect, who entered the camp illegally and was filling bags with hunting equipment. The warden arrived and aided in getting the suspect, the suspect's vehicle, and the officers out of the property. The warden had previously arrested the suspect for theft of property and stealing an ATV and other property from a nearby deer lease in 2017. The suspect was charged with burglary of a habitation and had a parole violation warrant for the earlier charge.

—Trial by Fire— A Polk County Game Warden responded to a boat fire on Lake Livingston. Upon arriving, the warden observed five individuals swimming in the water near a boat engulfed in flames. A young boy swimming from the flames stated he was

tired and could not swim well. The warden removed his gun belt, swam toward the boy, and pulled him to safety. He noticed another individual struggling to swim and assisted him safely back to shore. The boat fire was extinguished by Onalaska Volunteer Fire Department. All occupants of the vessel were safe and uninjured.

–Gator Done— Orange County Game Wardens received a call from the Orange County Sheriff's Office Dispatch reporting several deputies were attending to an alligator near Bridge City. A game warden responded to the popular fishing spot and discovered three teenagers had caught a 7-foot alligator. The youths had also enlisted the help of another person to kill it. The three teenagers were cited for taking the alligator in closed season. The alligator was turned over to a nuisance control hunter. Cases are pending.

--The Other White Meat--The Texas Game Warden Criminal Investigation Division (CID) provided Bexar

County Game Wardens with information regarding an individual selling deer meat on Craigslist. The game wardens responded to a residence in Southern Bexar County where the suspect admitted to attempting to sell the deer meat and gave information where the white-tailed deer had been killed. The individual was cited for selling white-tailed deer meat.

-What's My Age Again? -- Wise and Jack County Game Wardens observed a male subject who appeared to have passed out on a pontoon boat. His legs were hanging from the passenger compartment near the engine while the vessel was underway. The wardens stopped the boat and determined the subject was underage and highly intoxicated. Other minors on the boat also admitted to consuming alcohol. An adult on the boat confessed to one of the wardens that he provided the alcohol knowing underage occupants were consuming it. One subject was placed under arrest for public intoxication and another arrested for the purchasing/furnishing alcohol to a minor. Citations for minors in consumption of alcohol were issued to in their system.

-X Marks the Spot- Bell County Game Wardens were contacted by a local landowner's agent who was on the property hunting hogs when he came across a male individual digging for arrowheads without the landowner's permission. Wardens arrived on the scene and discovered an eight-foot hole the suspect had dug and several artifacts. The wardens arrested the digger. The suspect had a lengthy criminal history and had recently been released from the penitentiary. He was charged with antiquities code violations, criminal trespass, and criminal mischief. Cases are pending.

-Party Foul- A Travis County Game Warden issued multiple citations to an individual operating an illegal party boat. In an attempt to skirt party boat regulations and avoid trespassing charges, the captain of the vessel coached the attendees of a bachelorette party to announce themselves to the marina as "friends". Consequentially, the party boat was denied access to the marina. However, the marina was kind enough to pro-

the occupants who had a detectable amount of alcohol vide a legal captain and lease the party another vessel to finish their celebration.

> -Deep in the Weeds-Jackson County Game Wardens were patrolling the coastal area of Jackson County for fisheries enforcement. They observed two individuals sitting in a truck at a local boat ramp of Carancahua Bay. There were kayaks in the bed of the truck and fish in a trash bag. The individual on the driver's side appeared nervous during conversation. One of the wardens asked the subject numerous times if there was anything illegal in the vehicle. The male subject changed the topic each time. Eventually, he stated that there was a little bit of weed in the vehicle. After conducting a search of the vehicle numerous drugs were discovered and seized including: 17 grams of methamphetamine, a THC vape pen, and thirty pills of hydrocodone and amphetamine. The male subject was arrested on four narcotics charges and a parole warrant.





